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Hello QRC

Please include the following in the submission to the redistribution authority.

The **Coomera electorate name should be retained**, rather than changed to Pimpama for the following reasons:

- First, the whole of the suburb of Coomera will be within the new boundary changes. This is not the case for the suburb of Pimpama, where a portion of that suburb will be in the new electorate of Oxenford.
- Additionally, there are 10 separately named suburbs within the proposed new electorate with the suburb of Coomera being the most dominant one due to the following factors:
 - The largest shopping centre, Westfields Coomera Town Centre, is the dominant town centre in the electorate.
 - Immediately behind Westfield is the stand-alone Costco Outlet.
 - Directly across Foxwell Road is the newly developed food and entertainment precinct, which will be further enhanced by the Dreamworld development that has now been called in by the Deputy Premier due to the significance of the project.
 - The 600 bed Coomera Hospital is currently under construction adjacent to the Coomera Town Centre and Coomera Train Station.
 - Several other significant commercial developments are occurring, including a proposed private hospital.

- A new residential community, with 4,000 lots, has been approved by City of Gold Coast, immediately north of the Coomera Town Centre and the Coomera Hospital.
- The recently approved Urbana 4 tower residential and retail complex, with more than 600 residential units, is expected to commence construction.

The above clearly confirms there will be continued significant growth within the suburb of Coomera, suggesting that the electorate name of Coomera will continue to be valid, beyond 2032 and the next redistribution.

Given the above, by retaining the name Coomera, which has been the electorate name since inception in 2009, there will be less voter confusion and disruption.
