To the Members of the Redistribution Commission,

I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposal to abolish the electoral district of Hill in the March 2026 electoral redistribution.

Our communities within the Hill electorate share strong social, economic, and geographic connections that justify maintaining dedicated representation.

Removing the electorate would weaken regional representation for a large portion of North and Far North Queensland and reduce access to parliamentary representatives for constituents, undermining fair and equitable representation for residents across our region.

While fair population representation is considered, electoral redistributions must also take into account geography, community of interest, and ongoing effective representation, particularly in large regional areas. In a state as vast and decentralised as Queensland, sufficient and dedicated representation is essential to ensure our regional communities are not overshadowed by the ever-growing population in South-East Queensland.

Hill is currently and historically represented by a minor party that reflects regional and rural interests. Abolishing Hill risks diminishing the diversity of political voices in the Queensland Parliament and reducing the visibility of regional perspectives.

For these reasons, I respectfully urge the Commission to reconsider the proposal and retain the electoral district of Hill, maintaining strong and effective representation for Far North Queensland communities.
