Objection to Proposed Electorate Boundary Redistribution.

To the Redistribution Committee, I'm writing to object to the proposed boundary changes that would move Geebung, including our business, Geebung Kindergarten and Preschool, from the Aspley electorate into Nudgee.

As a long-standing part of the Geebung community, this change doesn't reflect how our community actually functions day to day, and we are very concerned about the impact it would have.

Our kindergarten, along with other important community organisations like Geebung RSL and Geebung Special School, are closely linked with services, families, and support networks within the Aspley electorate.

We've built strong, ongoing relationships with our current member for parliament, which makes a real difference when advocating for the needs of young children and families. Changing electorates would disrupt that continuity and make it harder to maintain those connections.

Each year, we take part in the Geebung Street Party, a fantastic community event hosted by our federal, state, and local members within our current electorate. This event is a major opportunity for us to connect with local families and is actually one of our key drivers for enrolments at Geebung Kindy.

If we are moved into a different electorate, we would no longer be part of this event. That would have a very real and significant impact on us, not just in terms of community connection, but financially as well. Losing that exposure and engagement opportunity could have devastating effects on our enrolments and long-term sustainability.

Our families live, work, and move within the Aspley area. From schooling and childcare to shopping and community activities, everything is naturally centred here. The proposed change doesn't seem to reflect these practical, everyday patterns.

It's difficult to see any real benefit this change would bring to our community. On the other hand, the downsides—disrupted relationships, reduced visibility at key community events, and financial impact on local organisations like ours—are very clear.

In closing, we strongly ask that Geebung remain together in its entirety within the Aspley electorate so that our community connections, support networks, and local institutions can continue to thrive without unnecessary disruption.
