Dear Commissioners,

I'm writing to object to the proposed boundary between Aspley and Nudgee, which cuts the suburb of Geebung in half.

I live in Geebung with my family. Under the proposed boundary, our home would be in one electorate while our kids' school and kindy — also in Geebung — would be in another. That doesn't make sense. If I need to raise an issue about traffic safety at school drop-off or a planning decision near the school, I'd have to go to a different MP than my own.

Geebung is a small suburb. We all use the same school, the same shops, the same station. Splitting it down the middle doesn't reflect how the suburb actually works as a community.

There are better options for the boundary at the edges of the suburb — Downfall Creek, or just following the gazetted suburb boundary — rather than running a line through the middle of people's neighbourhood. The Commission's own report says Aspley has "minimal or no changes," so I don't see why this split is necessary. Both electorates are comfortably within quota and keeping all of Geebung in Aspley wouldn't change that.

I ask that the boundary be adjusted so the whole of Geebung stays in Aspley.
