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Dear Electoral Commission of Queensland

I am writing to formally lodge my objection to the draft state electoral boundaries that propose removing the part of Geebung east of Newman Road from the Aspley electorate.

My objections are based on the following concerns regarding the integrity and representation of our local community:

- **Fragmentation of Community Representation:** The proposal to move eastern Geebung into the Nudgee electorate would result in fragmented representation for a cohesive and established suburb.
- **Separation of Key Community Landmarks:** This boundary change would physically and politically separate essential community hubs from the rest of Geebung.

Specifically, I am concerned that the following landmarks would be cut off from the heart of our electorate:

- Geebung RSL and the Geebung Train Station.
- Education and childcare facilities, including St Kevin's Primary School, Geebung Special School, and C&K Geebung Kindergarten and Pre-School.
- Local sporting and retail centers, such as Aspley Little Athletics and the Geebung shops on Newman Road.
- **Maintenance of Community Identity:** Geebung is a strong, proud community that should be kept together. Splitting the suburb in half ignores the natural social and economic connections that residents rely on daily.

Splitting an electorate in half makes no sense, other than serving the political purpose of the current day.

I urge the Commission to reconsider this redistribution to ensure that Geebung remains a whole community within a single electorate.
