There is great diversity of the agriculture industries in the Hill electorate , with unique agriculture enterprises operating in a broad climatic range including wet tropics, coastal and savanna regions. This means we need a representation in the parliament not based on sheer numbers within a electorate, but one that can adequately represent the needs and concerns of primary production in the far North of the state which is markedly different then central and southern Queensland industries and locations.
