Dear Commissioner

I am a resident of Maiwar Electorate at

I am making a submission in relation to the name and boundaries of the Maiwar Electorate.

I understand the LNP has proposed to rename Maiwar from its current First Nations name of Maiwar to the old name of Indooroopilly and return to the boundaries when the LNP last won the seat in 2015 — which would involve moving large amounts of Auchenflower and Toowong into Cooper while jumping the Brisbane River to put Chelmer, Graceville and Sherwood in Maiwar. Apart from a blatant attempt at making the seat friendlier to the LNP at the cost of good sense and natural communities of interest, a single bridge does not create a cohesive community between Indooroopilly and Chelmer. Population growth can be accommodated through the much more logical transfer of Fig Tree Pocket, already disconnected from the rest of Maiwar, to Moggill while gaining more of the urban neighbourhoods near Milton.

I therefore do not support the LNP's proposed change of name or this method of changing the boundary.

Instead, I would be in favour of Fig Tree Pocket being moved to Moggill. Proposals that mention this include: 14,19,32,77,95,99,100,101,108,109,112,115,117 Parts of Bardon south of Ithaca Creek and parts of Rosalie are currently split across electorates and should be reunited in Maiwar as per the QG submission).

Bardon - Proposals that mention it 109,112

Rosalie - Proposals that mention it 19,81,95,100,101,109,112,117

Key changes to mention to oppose

In summary, the electorate boundary should not cross the Brisbane River, which is clear natural boundary

AND the Chelmer, Graceville, Sherwood Peninsula (Oxley Reach) is a clear community with common interests and should not be split across multiple electorates.
