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Queensland Redistribution

Pre redistribution analysis.

I'd like to first acknowledge @Angas from <https://www.tallyroom.com.au/> for the wonderful tool he created to help with this redistribution <https://auredistribution.neocities.org/>. It was truly helpful in creating a fast efficient redistribution.

When deciding where to begin my redistribution i though it could only be done in one of two places. Either in the north or on the Gold Coast, I decided to start in the north and then sweep down across regional and rural Queensland down to the border with the Sunshine Coast and Southern Queensland. Then I worked my way in an anticlockwise direction from the Gold Coast into Redlands and the south of Brisbane. Then Logan and across through Ipswich and the north of Brisbane ending Moreton Bay. This was to allow to do it by region and separate LGAs where possible. I grouped them by region and tried where I was able to separate several LGAs and order the seats in the more urban south-east.

I've chosen to abolish one seat in regional Queensland being Mirani and one seat in Brisbane south of the river being Toohey. This is due to the deficits in both regions requiring a seat to be abolished. I've also chosen to create a new seat in Moreton Bay named D'Aguilar and a new seat in Logan called Flagstone. This is due to surpluses in both regions requiring an additional seat.

The naming conventions I've chosen to use is place names as it better reflected the communities being represented as well as making it easier for them to locate. Naming after persons are best saved for federal seats. The exception to this is the vast seats in Regional Queensland which aren't centred on any community.

I've renamed several seats to better reflect the community they represent.

I've also attempted to unite several SA1s and have drawn boundaries that occur over bodies of water to align with those of the respective suburbs/localities.

NORTHERN QUEENSLAND

Cook – Current Electors 36,866 with a Weighted Enrolment of 40,823 due to Large District Allowance (+1.39%), Projected Electors 39,436 with a Weighted Enrolment of 43,373 due to Large District Allowance (-2.92%). Gains all the Shire of Mareeba along with 2,551.343139 sqkm and 51 additional area electors from Hill. Renamed York after the Cape York peninsula it occupies due to Cook already being a federal division with the same namesake. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 37,985 with a Weighted Enrolment of 41,993 due to Large District Allowance (+4.29%), Projected Electors 40,475 with a Weighted Enrolment of 44,463 due to Large District Allowance (-0.48%).

Traeger – Current Electors 27,622 with a Weighted Enrolment of 36,240 due to Large District Allowance (-9.99%), Projected Electors 28,337 with a Weighted Enrolment of 36,915 due to Large District Allowance (-17.38%). Gains the shires of Winton, Boulia and Diamantina along with 209,451 sqkm and 4189 additional area electors from Gregory. Renamed Gregory to preserve the name of district that's existed since 1878 through the transfer of over 200,000 sqkm of its territory now that Gregory has the prospect of being defined by a geographic name. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 28,921 with a Weighted Enrolment of 41,728 due to Large District Allowance (3.64%), Projected Electors 29,509 with a Weighted Enrolment of 42,276 due to Large District Allowance (-5.38%).

Cairns currently has enough electors for 3 seats. Therefore, Cairns is only required to be in 3 seats (Barron River, Cairns and Mulgrave) as opposed to the current 4 seats (Barron River, Cairns, Hill and Mulgrave). Despite these being at quota some minor boundary changes can be done. Most residents of both the Mulgrave and Hill districts would agree that the parts of Cairns in Hill belong in Mulgrave due to Community of Interest concerns.

Barron River – Current Electors 42,075 (+4.50%), Projected Electors 44,989 (+0.70%). Remains unchanged. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,075 (+4.50%), Projected Electors 44,989 (+0.70%).

Cairns – Current Electors 39,608 (-1.63%), Projected Electors 43,234 (-3.24%). Gains everything north of Toogood Road and Hillcrest Street creek from Mulgrave. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,688 (+3.54%), Projected Electors 45,401 (+1.62%).

Mulgrave – Current Electors 40,378 (+0.28%), Projected Electors 45,919 (+2.78%). Loses everything north of Toogood Road and Hillcrest Street creek to Cairns. Gains the rest of the City of Cairns from Hill. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,358 (+0.23%), Projected Electors 45,889 (+2.71%).

Hill – Current Electors 42,158 (+4.70%), Projected Electors 44,495 (-0.41%). Loses the parts of the Shire of Mareeba to Cook. Loses the parts of the City of Cairns to Mulgrave. Gains the remainder of the Cassowary Coast LGA from Hinchinbrook including the namesake Island. Renamed Johnstone after the main river system flowing through the seat. Several SA1s transferred to Hill from Hinchinbrook were divided but there was a low elector amount. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 42,322 (+5.11%), Projected Electors 44,308 (-0.83%).

Townsville currently has enough electors for 3.5 seats or thereabouts. Therefore, Townsville is only required to be in 4 seats (Halifax currently known as Hinchinbrook, Thuringowa, Townsville and

Mundingburra) as opposed to the current 5 seats (Halifax currently known as Hinchinbrook, Thuringowa, Townsville, Mundingburra and Burdekin.)

Hinchinbrook – Current Electors 39,631 (-1.47%), Projected Electors 47,539 (+6.40%). Loses all of Cassowary Coast Loses the Cassowary Coast LGA to Hill including the namesake Island. Renamed Halifax after the Bay encompassing the seat after the loss of the namesake island. Several SA1s transferred to Hill from Hinchinbrook were divided but there was a low elector amount. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 36,569 (-9.18%), Projected Electors 44,458 (-0.49%).

While the current elector numbers are at the extreme range of the under quota approximately -9.18% under quota growth in particularly the Townsville parts put it at only -0.49% on projected numbers in 2032. Should the numbers push it over the -10% threshold the commission can simply add enough electors from Thuringowa to get in back within range.

Thuringowa – Current Electors 38,922 (-3.33%), Projected Electors 39,613 (-11.31%). Gains territory north of Ross River Road and west of Nathan Street from Mundingburra. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,971 (+1.76%), Projected Electors 41,622 (-6.84%).

Townsville – Current Electors 38,002 (-5.30%), Projected Electors 39,622 (-11.34%). Remains unchanged. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,002 (-5.30%), Projected Electors 39,622 (-11.34%).

While there is a projected deficit it's within the current elector numbers which is the only requirement. Altering the boundary would cause problems in neighbouring seats. This can be a task for the next redistribution when it will be outside the requirements.

Mundingburra – Current Electors 35,385 (-12.13%), Projected Electors 37,855 (-15.27%). Loses everything north of Ross River Road and west of Nathan Street to Thuringowa. Gains all of Townsville from Burdekin. Renamed Ross after the river due to the seat now representing a much larger area. Due to SA1 31802148903 being part in Townsville and part in Burdekin shire I've been unable to determine the exact number of electors after redistribution but have given a small range (Current Electors 37,169-37,455 (-7.69% (-)-6.98%), Projected Electors 41,729-42051 (-6.60% (-)-5.88%).

Burdekin – Current Electors 36,939 (-8.26%), Projected Electors 39,575 (-11.42%). Loses all of Townsville to Mundingburra. Loses all of Mackay Region to Whitsunday. Loses all of Issac Region to Gregory. Gains all of Whitsunday Region from Whitsunday along with the Cumberland Islands in Mackay Region due to the transport links being in Whitsunday Region. Due to both Burdekin and Whitsunday namesakes being in the one seat I've chosen to retain the Burdekin name as most of the electors have come from this seat. However, Whitsunday may also be appropriate given most of the electors come from Whitsunday Region. Due to SA1 31802148903 being part in Townsville and part in Burdekin Shire I've been unable to determine the exact number of electors after redistribution but have given a small range (Current Electors 38,136-38,630 (-5.29% (-)-4.06+%), Projected Electors 40,632-41149 (-9.06% (-)-7.90%).

Whitsunday – Current Electors 39,413 (-2.12%), Projected Electors 45,323 (1.44%). Loses all of Whitsunday Region along with the Cumberland Islands in Mackay Region due to the transport links being in Whitsunday Region to Burdekin. Gains all of Mackay Region from Burdekin. Gains all of Mackay Region north of Alligator Creek from Mirani (excluding the territory inside the Mackay Ring Road south of the Pioneer River and east to where Bakers Creek meets the Ocean). Renamed

Pioneer River after the main river in the seat and due to Whitsunday namesake being removed.

Given the SA1 31202135231 crosses the Alligator River boundary with Mirani I've provided an estimate range though I don't imagine it would be too much higher than the minimum as there is very minimal territory north of the river in that SA1. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 37,326-37,840 (-7.30% (-)-6.02%), Projected Electors 42,212-42,741 (-5.52% (-)-4.34%%).

Mackay – Current Electors 40753 (1.21%), Projected Electors 42,456 (-4.97%). Gains all the territory inside the Mackay Ring Road south of the Pioneer River and east to where Bakers Creek meets the Ocean from Mirani. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,827 (+8.85%), Projected Electors 45,846 (+2.61%).

CENTRAL QUEENSLAND

Mirani – ABOLISHED – Current Electors 37,942 (=5.77%), Project Electors 40,140 (=10.24%). Loses all the Mackay Region north of Alligator Creek from to Whitsunday (excluding the territory inside the Mackay Ring Road south of the Pioneer River and east to where Bakers Creek meets the Ocean).

Loses all the territory inside the Mackay Ring Road south of the Pioneer River and east to where Bakers Creek meets the Ocean Loses to Mackay. Loses all of Issac Region, all of Shire of Livingstone to Keppel. Loses the entire Rockhampton Region to Callide. Seat ABOLISHED. Namesake is now in Whitsunday. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 0,000 (-100.00%), Projected Electors 0,000 (-100.00%).

Gregory – Current Electors 26,375 with a Weighted Enrolment of 35,569 due to Large District Allowance (-11.6%), Projected Electors 26,726 with a Weighted Enrolment of 35,920 due to Large District Allowance (-19.6%). Loses all of Winton, Boulia and Diamantina shires along with 209,451 sqkm and 4189 additional area electors to Traegar. Due to SA1 312011338912 being part in the seat of Burdekin and part in the seat of Mirani I've been unable to determine the exact number of electors after redistribution but have given a small range. Gains all of Issac Region from Burdekin along with between 48,034.195768- 56,211.528768 sqkm and 961 and 1124 additional area electors from Burdekin. Renamed Thomson after the Thomson River as the seat can now be defined by a geographic location. The name of Gregory is preserved by transferring to Traeger through the transfer of over 200,000 sqkm of territory to Traegar. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 36,060-36,268 with a Weighted Enrolment of 42,025-42,397 due to Large District Allowance (+4.37%-5.30%+%), Projected Electors 36,064-36259 with a Weighted Enrolment of 42,029-42,388 due to Large District Allowance (-5.93% (-)-%).

Keppel – Current Electors 41,267 (2.49%), Projected Electors 47,036 (5.28%). Loses all of Rockhampton to Rockhampton. Gains all remaining area from the Mackay Region from Mirani south of Alligator River. Gains all of Issac Region from Mirani, Gains all of Shire of Livingstone from Mirani.

The boundary for the seat is now Alligator River in the north down to the Fitzroy River and the boundary of Rockhampton. Renamed Shoalwater after the Bay encompassed by the seat. Other name suggestions include Broad Sound and Fitzroy after the main river in the seat. Given the SA1 31202135231 crosses the Alligator River, though it would be closer to the higher end due to most of the territory being south of the creek and SA1 312011338912 being part in the seat of Burdekin and part in the seat of Mirani I've provided an estimate range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 41,069-41,791 (+2.00-+3.79%), Projected Electors 46,490-47,214 (+4.05%-+5.67%).

Rockhampton – Current Electors 39,444 (-2.04%), Projected Electors 41,531 (-7.05%). Loses all of Rockhampton west of the Rockhampton Airport, Murray Lagoon and Yeppen Yeppen Lagoon. As well as everything south of the Railway Line and Arthur Street to Callide. Gains all of Rockhampton from Keppel. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,702 (+6.06%), Projected Electors 45,587 (+2.03%).

Gladstone – Current Electors 37,796 (-6.13%), Projected Electors 40,517 (-9.32%). Gains all of the Gladstone Region from Callide. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,446 (+5.42%), Projected Electors 45,670 (+2.22%).

BURNETT & WIDE BAY

Callide – Current Electors 37,100 (-7.86%), Projected Electors 38,465 (-13.91%). Loses all the Gladstone Region to Gladstone. Loses all the Bundaberg Region to Burnett. Loses all the former Wambo Shire (now a part of Western Downs Region) to Warrego. Gains all of Rockhampton west of the Rockhampton Airport, Murray Lagoon and Yeppen Yeppen Lagoon. As well as everything south of the Railway Line and Arthur Street from Rockhampton. Gains the entire Rockhampton Region from Mirani. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,847 (+3.93%), Projected Electors 43,608 (-2.40%).

Bundaberg – Current Electors 38,105 (-5.36%), Projected Electors 39,802 (-10.91%). Loses everything north of the Burnett River namely the suburb of Bundaberg North, along with the parts south of Elverys Road and Silky Oak Street (Dawn Parade and Clearview Avenue) to Burnett (this is to create a natural boundary using the river). Gains all the territory north of Windermere Road, Rifle Range Road and the Mary Kinross Memorial Park inclusive from Burnett. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,743 (-2.09%), Projected Electors 46,287 (+3.60%).

Burnett – Current Electors 42,790 (6.27%), Projected Electors 45,228 (1.23%). Loses all the territory north of Windermere Road, Rifle Range Road and the Mary Kinross Memorial Park inclusive to Bundaberg. Gains everything north of the Burnett River namely the suburb of Bundaberg North, along with the parts south of Elverys Road and Silky Oak Street (Dawn Parade and Clearview Avenue) from Bundaberg (this is to create a natural boundary using the river). Gains all the Bundaberg Region from Callide. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,652 (+3.45%), Projected Electors 43,327 (-3.03%).

Hervey Bay – Current Electors 45,459 (12.9%), Projected Electors 48,334 (8.2%). Loses the localities of Booral, River Heads, Susan River, Bunya Creek and Nikenbah to Maryborough. Loses K'Gari/Fraser Island to Gympie. Gains the remainder of the locality of Urraween from Maryborough. Given the SA1 31904151603 is in both Maryborough and Hervey Bay and SA1 31905152217 only moving K'Gari/Fraser Island which the majority would live on, as access to Big Woody Island is still in Hervey Bay, I've provided an estimate range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 41,062-42,530 (+1.98%-+5.63%), Projected Electors 43,117-45,121 (-3.49%-+0.99%).

Maryborough – Current Electors 43,891 (9.01%), Projected Electors 47,598 (6.53%). Loses all the locality of Urraween to Hervey Bay. Loses everything east of the Mary River and the remainder of the locality of Tiaro to Gympie. Gains the localities of Booral, River Heads, Susan River, Bunya Creek and Nikenbah and from Hervey Bay. I've provided an estimate range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 37,446-38,914 (-7.00% (-)-3.35%), Projected Electors 40,971-42,883 (-8.3% (-)-4.02%).

Gympie – Current Electors 45,308 (12.53%), Projected Electors 48,940 (9.54%). Loses everything west of the Mary River plus the remainder of the locality of Bells Bridge up to the locality of Sexton to Nanango. Gains everything east of the Mary River and the remainder of the locality of Tiaro from Maryborough. Gains K'Gari/Fraser Island from Hervey Bay. SA1 31903151436 is partially in Wrattens Forest in neighbouring Nanango so this may mean a few electors are already in Nanango but would be minimal. Renamed Tin Can Bay after the bay in the seat as the Gympie name no longer represents the entire seat. Given SA1 31905152217 only moving K'Gari/Fraser Island which the majority would live on, as access to Big Woody Island is still in Hervey Bay, I've provided very small estimate range.

After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,314-39,413 (-2.36% (-)-2.11%), Projected Electors 42,390-42,482 (-5.12% (-)-4.92%).

Nanango – Current Electors 41,784 (3.77%), Projected Electors 43,625 (-2.36%). Loses all the Somerset Region to the new seat of D'Aguilar. Loses the localities of Benarkin, Benarkin North, Blackbutt, Blackbutt South, Blackbutt North, Nukku and Taromeo and all the Toowoomba Region to Condamine. Gains everything west of the Mary River plus the remainder of the locality of Bells Bridge up to the locality of Sexton from Gympie. Renamed Barambah after the lake at the centre of the seat. SA1 31903151436 is partially in Wrattens Forest is already in Nanango so this may mean some electors are already in Nanango and won't be transferred but this would be minimal. Given SA1 30702117908 is partially in Condamine and partially in Nanango, I've provided an estimate range After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 42,788-43,226 (+6.27%-+7.36%), Projected Electors 45,102-45,544 (+0.95%-+1.94%).

SOUTHERN QUEENSLAND

Condamine – Current Electors 43,287 (7.51%), Projected Electors 47,912 (7.24%). Loses the localities of Pilton, Upper Pilton, Manapouri, Headington Hill, Spring Creek, Kings Creek, Back Plains, Ryeford, Sandy Camp, Mount Molar, Nevilton, Missen Flat, Elphinstone, Ellangowan, Leyburn, Felton South, Nobby, Ascot, Hirstglen, West Haldon, Budgee, Clifton, Greenmount, East Greenmount, Grassdale and Ramsay and the parts of the locality of Felton east of Hodgson Creek along with the remaining part of the localities of Victoria Hill and Cecil Plains to Southern Downs. Loses the remainder of Darling Heights and Kearneys Spring localities to Toowoomba South. Gains all the Toowoomba Region along with the localities of Benarkin, Benarkin North, Blackbutt, Blackbutt South, Blackbutt North, Nukku and Taromeo from Nanango. Renamed Oakey after the populous town in the seat. SA1 30703118604 in Victoria Hill is mostly already in Southern Downs so this but this would be a minimal amount. Given SA1 30702117908 is partially in Condamine and partially in Nanango, I've provided an estimate range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 41,877-42,315 (+4.01-+5.09%), Projected Electors 45,072-45,514 (+0.88%-+1.87%).

Southern Downs – Current Electors 39,003 (-3.13%), Projected Electors 40,402 (-9.57%). Gains the localities of Pilton, Upper Pilton, Manapouri, Headington Hill, Spring Creek, Kings Creek, Back Plains, Ryeford, Sandy Camp, Mount Molar, Nevilton, Missen Flat, Elphinstone, Ellangowan, Leyburn, Felton South, Nobby, Ascot, Hirstglen, West Haldon, Budgee, Clifton, Greenmount, East Greenmount, Grassdale and Ramsay and the parts of the locality of Felton east of Hodgson Creek along with the remaining part of the localities of Victoria Hill and Cecil Plains from Condamine. SA1 30703118604 in Victoria Hill is mostly already in Southern Downs so this but this would be a minimal amount. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,122 (+7.10%), Projected Electors 44,712 (+0.07%).

Warrego – Current Electors 31,810 with a Weighted Enrolment of 38,566 due to Large District Allowance (-4.22%), Projected Electors 31,968 with a Weighted Enrolment of 38,724 due to Large District Allowance (-13.33%) Gains all the former Wambo Shire (now a part of Western Downs

Region) along with 2971.126951 sqkm and 60 additional voters from Callide. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 31,810 with a Weighted Enrolment of 40,646 due to Large District Allowance (+0.95%), Projected Electors 34,083 with a Weighted Enrolment of 40,899 due to Large District Allowance (-8.46%).

Toowoomba South – Current Electors 40,405 (0.35%), Projected Electors 41,040 (-8.14%). Loses the remainder of the locality of Newtown to Toowoomba North. Gains the remainder of Darling Heights and Kearneys Spring localities from Condamine. Renamed Harristown after the populous locality as given Toowoomba is now spread across four seats it is more in the centre. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,686 (+1.05%), Projected Electors 42,624 (-4.60%).

Toowoomba North – Current Electors 41,360 (2.72%), Projected Electors 43,807 (-1.95%). Gains the remainder of the locality of Newtown from Toowoomba South. Renamed Toowoomba after the city as given Toowoomba is now spread across four seats it is more in the centre and is the main seat. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,368 (+5.23%), Projected Electors 44,802 (+0.28%).

Lockyer – Current Electors 40,406 (0.35%), Projected Electors 45,129 (1.01%). Remains unchanged. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,406 (0.35%), Projected Electors 45,129 (1.01%).

SUNSHINE COAST

Noosa – Current Electors 38,912 (-3.36%), Projected Electors 40,690 (-8.93%). Gains the part of the locality of Cooroy that's north of the Bruce Highway along with the locality of Cooran and the remainder of the locality of Lake Macdonald from Nicklin. SA1 31608154901 in Cooroy is mostly in Nicklin except for a very small tip but this would likely be a minimal amount if any. Given SA1 31608154957 is split between Nicklin and Noosa, I've provided an estimate range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 42,584-42,816 (+5.76%-+6.34%), Projected Electors 44,594-44,817 (-0.19%-+0.03%).

Nicklin – Current Electors 40,079 (-0.46%), Projected Electors 44,102 (-1.29%). Loses the part of the locality of Cooroy that's north of the Bruce Highway along with the locality of Cooran and the remainder of the locality of Lake Macdonald to Noosa. Gains the locality of Flaxton from Glass House. Renamed Nambour after the populous town in the seat. SA1 31608154901 in Cooroy is mostly in Nicklin except for a very small tip but this would likely be a minimal amount if any. SA1 31608154957 are split between Nicklin and Noosa. I've provided an estimate range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 37,079-37,311 (-7.91% (-)-7.33%), Projected Electors 40,891-41,114 (-8.48% (-)-7.98%).

Ninderry – Current Electors 44,120 (9.58%), Projected Electors 46,877 (4.92%). Loses part of the town of Buderim that's east of Main Road to Buderim. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,850 (+3.94%), Projected Electors 44,608 (-0.16%).

Maroochydore – Current Electors 38,950 (-3.26%), Projected Electors 43,264 (-3.17%). Remains unchanged. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,950 (-3.26%), Projected Electors 43,264 (-3.17%).

Buderim – Current Electors 42,925 (6.61%), Projected Electors 50,642 (13.35%). Loses the parts of the locality of Palmview south of Sippy Creek to Glass House. Gains the part of the suburb of

Buderim that's east of Main Road from Ninderry. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,158 (-0.26%), Projected Electors 41,203 (-7.78%).

Kawana – Current Electors 40,701 (1.08%), Projected Electors 43,512 (-2.61%). Remains unchanged. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,701 (1.08%), Projected Electors 43,512 (-2.61%).

Caloundra – Current Electors 47,304 (17.48%), Projected Electors 64,866 (45.23%). Probably the biggest problem this entire redistribution. Can't lose that big surplus without falling under the 10% requirement or having strange boundaries. Fortunately, the rules state it only need to fit within 10% tolerance on current boundaries. The future projection can be handled at the next redistribution. Loses everything west of the Bruce Highway, the locality of Coochin Creek except the small portion north of Bells Creek Road that intersects with Roys Road and the Bruce Highway to Glass House. SA1s 31606143913, 31606143925 and 31606143917 are partially in both Glass House and Caloundra so I've provided an estimated range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 37,408-38,271 (-7.09% (-)-4.95%), Projected Electors 53,284-54,415. (+19.26%-+21.79%).

Glass House – Current Electors 39,769 (-1.23%), Projected Electors 53,591 (19.95%). Loses the locality of Flaxton to Nicklin. Loses all the City of Moreton Bay to the new seat of D'Aguilar. Gains the parts of the locality of Palmview south of Sippy Creek from Buderim. Gains everything west of the Bruce Highway, the locality of Coochin Creek except the small portion north of Bells Creek Road that intersects with Roys Road and the Bruce Highway from Caloundra. Given SA1s 31606143913, 31606143925 and 31606143917 are partially in both Glass House and Caloundra, SA1s 31302136902 and 31302136906 are in both Glass House and Morayfield and SA1 31302136702 is in both Glass House and Pumicestone, I've provided an estimated range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 37,327(-7.29%)-39,186 (-2.68%), Projected Electors 46142(+3.27%)-51,759 (+15.85%).

GOLD COAST

Currumbin – Current Electors 38,331 (-4.8%), Projected Electors 41,026 (-8.17%). Gains parts of the suburb of Palm Beach south of Fourth Avenue and Palm Beach Avenue from Burleigh. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,658 (+3.46%), Projected Electors 44,700 (+0.05%).

Burleigh – Current Electors 38,361 (-4.73%), Projected Electors 41,440 (-7.25%). Loses parts of the suburb of Palm Beach south of Fourth and Palm Beach Avenues to Currumbin. Gains the remainder of the suburb of Burleigh Waters along with the suburb of Miami from Mermaid Waters. There are a few electors south of Christine Avenue in SA1 30901122916 already in Burleigh, but this should be minimal. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,902 (+6.55%), Projected Electors 46,064 (+3.10%).

Mermaid Waters – Current Electors 38,721 (-3.83%), Projected Electors 41,804 (-6.43%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Burleigh Waters along with the suburb of Miami from Burleigh. Gains the suburb of Clear Island Waters from Surfers Paradise. Gains part of the suburb of Robina up to the Mudgeeraba Creek from Mudgeeraba. There are a few electors south of Christine Avenue in SA1 30901122916 already in Burleigh, but this should be minimal. Also, SA1 transferred from Mudgeeraba is already partially in Mermaid Waters but there appears to be a minimal number of electors in that

area. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,373 (-2.21%), Projected Electors 42,704 (-4.42%).

Mudgeeraba – Current Electors 42,012 (4.34%), Projected Electors 47,087 (5.39%). Loses part of the suburb of Robina up to the Mudgeeraba Creek to Mermaid Water. Gains everything south of Neilsens Road from the suburb of Carrara from Gaven. There are a few electors in a split SA1 30906124601, but this should be minimal. Also, SA1 transferred from Mudgeeraba is already partially in Mermaid Waters but there appears to be a minimal number of electors in that area. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,932 (-3.31%), Projected Electors 43,535 (-2.56%).

Surfers Paradise – Current Electors 38,267 (-4.96%), Projected Electors 48,401 (8.33%). Loses the suburb of Clear Island Waters to Mermaid Waters. Gains the remainder of the suburb of Bundall from Southport. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 36,305 (-9.87%), Projected Electors 45,054 (+0.83%). While it's just above the lower threshold on current numbers, it's projected to grow to about average quota on projected numbers.

Broadwater – Current Electors 38,948 (-3.27%), Projected Electors 44,140 (-1.21%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Helensvale to Theodore. Gains the part of the suburb of Biggera Waters west of Biggera Creek from Bonney. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,971 (-3.21%), Projected Electors 46,140 (+3.27%). Changes made to unite Helensvale into 2 seats rather than 3.

Theodore – Current Electors 39,388 (-2.18%), Projected Electors 46,015 (2.99%). Loses everything west of the Pacific Highway. Everything that's south of the Coomera River to Gaven and everything that's north of the Coomera River to Coomera. Gains the suburbs of Coomera and Pimpana from Coomera using the Coomera and Pimpana Rivers along with the Pacific Highway as its boundaries. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 36,871-37,869 (-8.43% to -5.95%), Projected Electors 51,132-52,091 (+14.44% to +16.59%). It's a bit over on projected numbers there is no rule stating it can be over projection wise, and it makes for nice natural boundaries.

Coomera – Current Electors 55,340 (37.44%), Projected Electors 71,060 (59.05%). Loses the suburbs of Coomera and Pimpana to Theodore using the Coomera and Pimpana Rivers along with the Pacific Highway as its boundaries. Gains everything west of the Pacific Highway that's north of the Coomera River from Theodore. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,889-44,460 (+9.00% to +10.42%), Projected Electors 50,212-50,777 (+12.38% to +13.65%). While it's just below the upper threshold on current numbers or going over a bit that's the extreme range of the estimate and should not exceed the upper threshold. It's a bit over on projected numbers there is no rule stating it can be over projection wise, and it makes for nice natural boundaries.

Gaven – Current Electors 35,612 (-11.55%), Projected Electors 37,205 (-16.73%). Loses parts of the suburb of Nerang that's east of the Pacific Highway and part of the suburb Carrara that's north of Neilsens Road to Bonney. Loses the part of the suburb of Carrara that's south of Neilsens Road to Mudgeeraba. Gains everything west of the Pacific Highway that's south of the Coomera River from Theodore. There are a few electors in a split SA1 30906124601, but this should be minimal. Renamed Pacific Pines after the populous suburb at the centre of the seat due to major changes. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,054-43,041 (%), Projected Electors 44,870-45,264 (+0.43% to +1.31%).

For Bonney and Southport, I have done two versions. One which involves the movement of as few electors possible. The other which is more ambitious and changes them from East/West seats to North/South seats. Both versions involve the use of the same suburbs just in different configuration, so it doesn't affect any other seat.

Configuration 1 – Ambitious

Bonney – Current Electors 38,453 (-5.65%), Projected Electors 49,000 (+9.67%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Southport along with the suburb of Labrador and part of the suburb of Biggera Waters east of Biggera Creek to Southport. Gains the suburbs of Ashmore, Benowa and Molendinar from Southport. Gains parts of the suburb of Nerang that's east of the Pacific Highway and part of the suburb Carrara that's north of Nielsens Road from Gaven. Renamed Ashmore after the populous suburb due to major changes. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,418 (-2.10%), Projected Electors 43,957 (-1.62%).

Southport – Current Electors 37,467 (-6.95%), Projected Electors 44,802 (0.28%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Bundall to Surfers Paradise. Loses the suburbs of Ashmore, Benowa and Molendinar to Bonney. Gains the remainder of the suburb of Southport along with the suburb of Labrador and part of the suburb of Biggera Waters east of Biggera Creek from Bonney. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,406 (+0.35%), Projected Electors 52,323 (+17.11%). Normally such a change would warrant a name change but this unites the suburb of Southport which is still the largest suburb in terms of numbers. An alternative name could be Labrador the only other suburb in the seat.

Configuration 2 – Basic

Bonney – Current Electors 38,453 (-5.65%), Projected Electors 49,000 (+9.67%). Gains the suburb of Molendinar from Southport. Gains parts of the suburb of Nerang that's east of the Pacific Highway and part of the suburb Carrara that's north of Nielsens Road from Gaven. Renamed Arundel after the populous suburb or an alternative Labrador the most populous suburb due to naming conventions. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,212 (-2.61%), Projected Electors 47,852 (+7.10%).

Southport – Current Electors 37,467 (-6.95%), Projected Electors 44,802 (0.28%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Bundall to Surfers Paradise. Loses the suburb of Molendinar to Bonney. Gains parts of the suburb of Nerang that's east of the Pacific Highway and part of the suburb Carrara that's north of Nielsens Road from Gaven. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,612 (+0.86%), Projected Electors 48,428 (+8.39%).

REDLANDS & LOGAN CITY

Redlands City has enough quota to fill 3 seats and there is really no justification for having part of it in neighbouring Springwood which is a part of the City of Logan.

Capalaba – Current Electors 37,988 (-5.65%), Projected Electors 38,211 (-14.48%). Gains everything west of Mains Road that's south of Birkdale Road and the locality of Birkdale from Oodgeroo. SA1 30101100336 is already partially in Capalaba but the number of electors should be minimal. Also gains the small part of Alexandra Hills from Redlands. After redistribution enrolment is, Current

Electors 44,068 (+9.45%), Projected Electors 44,456 (-0.50%). Just makes the cut on Current Electors at the maximum range but has slow growth that will see it reduce to average at the next redistribution.

Oodgeroo – Current Electors 35,350 (-12.21%), Projected Electors 37,823 (-15.34%). Loses everything west of Mains Road that's south of Birkdale Road and the locality of Birkdale to Capalaba. Gains the locality of Thornlands from Redlands. SA1 30101100336 is already partially in Capalaba but the number of electors should be minimal. Renamed back to Cleveland as it was a more suitable name for the seat and was done without consultation. Oodgeroo would better be served as a federal seat name, and this would make it available. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,370 (+2.75%), Projected Electors 41,941 (-6.13%).

Redlands – Current Electors 43,404 (+7.8%), Projected Electors 47,682 (+6.72%). Loses the locality of Thornlands to Oodgeroo. Loses gains the small part of Alexandra Hills to Capalaba. Gains the rest of the City of Redlands from Springwood. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,821 (-1.10%), Projected Electors 43,177 (-3.36%).

Springwood – Current Electors 37,187 (-7.64%), Projected Electors 37,628 (-15.78%). Loses the suburb of Shailer Park to Macalister. Loses the City of Redlands from Springwood. Gains the suburbs of Underwood and Slacks Creek (except for a small portion in SA1 31101133007 which is transferred to Woodridge) from Waterford. Gains the suburb of Woodridge from Woodridge along with the parts of Logan Central north of Wembley Road. Renamed Slacks Creek so it doesn't get confused with the new seat of Springfield. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,228 (+2.39%), Projected Electors 42,471 (-4.94%).

Macalister – Current Electors 42,889 (+6.52%), Projected Electors 47,573 (+6.48%). Loses the suburbs of Edens Landing, Bahrs Scrub, Windaroo, Bannockburn, Holmview along with the remainder of Waterford, and part of Beenleigh south of the railway line to Waterford. Gains the suburb of Shailer Park from Springwood. Gains the suburb of Tanah Merah and the remainder of the suburb of Loganholme from Waterford. Renamed Eagleby after the populous suburb in the centre of the seat. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,756 (-1.26%), Projected Electors 40,858 (-8.55%).

Waterford – Current Electors 40,494 (+0.57%), Projected Electors 45,114 (+0.98%). Loses the suburbs of Underwood and Slacks Creek (except for a small portion in SA1 31101133007 which is transferred to Woodridge) to Springwood. Loses the suburb of Tanah Merah and the remainder of the suburb of Loganholme to Macalister. Loses everything else north of the Logan River to Woodridge. Gains everything east of the Logan River down to Anzac Avenue then down Waterford-Tamborine Avenue along with the parts of Logan Village east of Towns Avenue from Logan. Gains the suburbs of Edens Landing, Bahrs Scrub, Windaroo, Bannockburn, Holmview along with the remainder of Waterford, and part of Beenleigh south of the railway line from Macalister. Renamed Albert after the river it borders as Waterford is effectively abolished despite retaining its namesake only a fraction of the original voters remain in the seat. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 37,545 (-6.25%), Projected Electors 44,558 (-0.27%). Rearranges the borders to pair some of the growth area with the already developed slower growing areas.

Woodridge – Current Electors 41,671 (+3.49%), Projected Electors 43,831 (-1.9%). Loses the suburb of Woodridge to Springwood along with the parts of Logan Central north of Wembley Road. Loses

the suburbs of Heritage Park and Regents Park along with most of Browns Plains (except for a small portion in SA1 31101131412 which runs through Heritage Park) to Logan. Gains the suburbs of Kingston, Meadowbrook, Loganlea, Waterford West and the part of Slacks Creek south of Queens Road from Waterford. Also gains the small protrusion of the City of Logan currently in Stretton, though this has very few electors. Renamed Marsden after the populous suburb at the centre of the seat given the namesake suburb has now been moved to Springwood. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,381 (-4.63%), Projected Electors 41,089 (-8.04%). Rearranges the borders to accommodate neighbouring seat changes.

Logan – Current Electors 51,432 (+27.74%), Projected Electors 67,441 (+50.95%). Loses everything east of the Logan River down to Anzac Avenue then down Waterford-Tamborine Avenue along with the parts of Logan Village east of Towns Avenue to Waterford. Loses everything west of the Mount Lindsay Highway to the new seat of Flagstone. Gains the rest of Logan Reserve from Waterford. Gains the suburbs of Heritage Park and Regents Park along with most of Browns Plains south of Browns Plains Road (except for a small portion in SA1 31101131412 which runs through Heritage Park) from Woodridge. Gains the remains parts of the suburbs of Browns Plains and Regents Park from Algeester. Retains the Logan name due to maintaining the Logan River and most of its electors come from the seat. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,072 (-2.96%), Projected Electors 50,369 (+12.73%). Rearranges the borders to pair some of the growth area with the already developed slower growing areas.

Flagstone - CREATED – Current Electors 0 (-100%), Projected Electors 0 (-100%). Gains all the City of Logan from Jordan. Gains everything west of the Mount Lindsay Highway from Logan. Gains the rest of the City of Logan from Algeester and Inala. Named Flagstone after the Greater District within City of Logan. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 37,001 (-8.10%), Projected Electors 50,181(+12.31%).

IPSWICH CITY

Jordan – Current Electors 48,596 (+20.69%), Projected Electors 65,795 (+47.26%). Loses all the City of Logan to the new seat of Flagstone. Gains the parts east of Redbank Plains Road and Queens Street up to Brisbane Road/Ipswich Motorway from Bundamba. Renamed Springfield after the City it encompasses after losing a lot of territory. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,925 (-0.84%), Projected Electors 50,135 (+12.21%).

Bundamba – Current Electors 47,062 (+16.88%), Projected Electors 57,674 (29.09%). Loses the parts east of Redbank Plains Road and Queens Street up to Brisbane Road/Ipswich Motorway from to Jordan. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,456 (+0.47%), Projected Electors 50,102 (+12.14%).

Ipswich – Current Electors 40,721 (+1.13%), Project Electors 52,877 (+18.35%). Loses all the area west of the Deebing Creek which is the suburb of Churchill along with the remainder of the suburb of Purga and part of the suburb of Deebing Heights north of the Centenary Highway that's west of Grampian Drive (this is to accommodate the fact SA1 is 31003129418 is in both Ipswich and Bundamba and contains a large number of projected electors) to Ipswich West. Given 31003129418 is split i have provided and estimated range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 36926 (-8.29%)-37,003 (-8.90%), Projected Electors 48928 (+9.51%)-49,015 (+9.70%).

Ipswich West (Current Electors 40,442 (+0.44%), Project Electors 49,813 (+11.49%). Loses all the area north of the Warrego Highway that east of the Brisbane Valley Highway along with the suburb of Karalee to Moggill. Gains all the City of Ipswich from Scenic Rim. Gains all the area west of the Deebing Creek which is the suburb of Churchill along with the remainder of the suburb of Purga and part of the suburb of Deebing Heights north of the Centenary Highway that's west of Grampian Drive (this is to accommodate the fact SA1 is 31003129418 is in both Ipswich and Bundamba and contains a large number of projected electors) to Ipswich West. Given 31003129418 along with SA1s 31002128242, 31002128201, 31002128216 and 31002128214 is split I have provided and estimated range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 38,327 (-4.81%)-39,358 (-2.25%), Projected Electors 46,897 (+4.96%)-48,301 (+8.11%).

NORTH BRISBANE

Clayfield – Current Electors 43,069 (+6.97%), Project Electors 48,711 (+9.03%). Remains Unchanged. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,069 (+6.97%), Project Electors 48,711 (+9.03%).

Nudgee – Current Electors 40,647 (+0.95%), Project Electors 42,325 (-5.27%). Gains all the area between Roghan Road and Handford Road which is a part of the suburb of Taigum from Sandgate. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,526 (+8.10%), Projected Electors 45,332 (+1.46%).

Sandgate – Current Electors 39,372 (-2.22%), Project Electors 40,138 (-10.16%). Loses all the area between Roghan Road and Handford Road which is a part of the suburb of Taigum to Nudgee. Gains all the territory north of Roghan Road which includes the entire suburb of Bald Hills and part of the suburbs of Bridgeman Downs and Carseldine from Aspley. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,930 (+1.65%), Projected Electors 41,955 (-6.10%).

Aspley – Current Electors 40,716 (+1.12%), Project Electors 42,017 (-5.96%). Loses all the territory north of Roghan Road which includes the entire suburb of Bald Hills and part of the suburbs of Bridgeman Downs and Carseldine to Sandgate. Loses all the suburb of Albany Creek to Everton. Gains all the territory north of Hamilton Road and all the territory north of Rode Road that's west of Webster Road from Stafford. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,388 (+5.28%), Projected Electors 44,264 (-0.93%).

Stafford – Current Electors 41,234 (+2.41%), Project Electors 43,601 (-2.41%). Loses part of the suburb of Chermside that's north of Hamilton Street along with most of the suburb of Chermside West north of Rode Road to its boundary of Webster Rad to Aspley. Gains the suburb of Everton Park along with the remainder of the suburbs of Chermside West and McDowall that's south of Rode Road from Everton. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,161 (+7.20%), Projected Electors 45,697 (+2.28%).

McConnel – Current Electors 42,731 (+6.13%), Project Electors 53,667 (+20.12%). Loses the suburb of Herston along with the remainder of the suburbs of Kelvin Grove and Red Hill to Cooper. Renamed Brisbane after the City of Brisbane as it occupies the CBD, the renaming in 2017 was unnecessary and unwarranted. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,303 (-4.87%), Projected Electors 48,524 (+8.61%).

Cooper – Current Electors 38,869 (-3.47%), Project Electors 40,957 (-8.33%). Loses the localities of Enoggera Reservoir and The Gap to Ferny Grove (the boundary being SA1s 30404110311, 30404110310, 30404110319 and 30404110313). Gains the remainder of the suburbs of Paddington, Bardon and Mildon along with parts of the localities of Auchenflower and Toowong that are north of Milton Road and Dean Street from Maiwar. Gains the suburb of Herston along with the remainder of the suburbs of Kelvin Grove and Red Hill from McConnell. Gains part of the suburb of Ashgrove south of Victoria and Banks Streets from Ferny Grove. Renamed Paddington after the populous suburb due to significant changes and as Cooper is also a federal division in Victoria and this would create confusion. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,069 (-0.48%), Projected Electors 43,047 (-3.66%).

Maiwar – Current Electors 41,016 (+1.87%), Project Electors 43,950 (-1.63%). Loses the remainder of the suburbs of Paddington, Bardon and Mildon along with parts of the suburbs of Auchenflower and Toowong that are north of Milton Road and Dean Street to Cooper. Gains the remainder of the suburbs of Mount Coot-Tha and Indooroopilly along with the suburb of Chapel Hill and part of the suburb of Kenmore Hill Down Bielby Road and Cedarleigh Road to Cubberla Creek from Moggill. Renamed Mount Coot-Tha after the mountain that dominates the seat. The renaming to Maiwar was unnecessary as this is only a small insignificant portion of the Brisbane River. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,650 (+3.44%), Projected Electors 44,507 (-0.38%).

Moggill – Current Electors 36,681 (-8.90%), Project Electors 37,011 (-17.16%). Loses the remainder of the suburbs of Mount Coot-Tha and Indooroopilly along with the suburb of Chapel Hill and part of the suburb of Kenmore Hill Down Bielby Road and Cedarleigh Road to Cubberla Creek to Maiwar. Gains all the area north of the Warrego Highway that east of the Brisbane Valley Highway along with the suburb of Karalee from Ipswich West. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 36,831 (-8.53%), Projected Electors 38,027 (-14.89%).

Ferny Grove – Current Electors 38,463(-4.47%), Project Electors 39,651 (-11.25%). Loses all the City of Moreton Bay parts of the seat including the suburb of Ferny Hills and the remainder of the suburbs of Bunya and Arani Hills to Everton. Loses part of the suburb of Ashgrove south of Victoria and Banks Streets to Cooper. Gains all the suburb of Enoggera Reservoir and the remainder of the suburb of The Gap from Cooper (the boundary being SA1s 30404110311, 30404110310, 30404110319 and 30404110313). Gains the remainder of the suburbs of Keperra, Mitchelton, Gaythorne, Alderley and Enoggera from Everton. Renamed Enoggera after the Enoggera Creek that borders it. I had thought about renaming Cooper to that as it takes in a more significant portion of the Creek but due to the locality of Enoggera and the locality of Enoggera Reservoir residing in this seat that may create some confusion. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,309 (+7.56%), Projected Electors 48,676 (+8.95%).

MORETON BAY

Loses the entirety of its portion of the City of Brisbane from Ferny Grove and Aspley except for a small part along the Albany Creek to make for a more contiguous boundary.

Gains the remainder of the City of Moreton Bay from the Brisbane based seats to make it an entirely Moreton Bay seat as the growth in Moreton Bay means it no longer needs to be a hybrid seat.

Everton – Current Electors 40,426 (+0.40%), Project Electors 42,644 (-4.55%). Loses the remainder of the suburbs of Keperra, Mitchelton, Gaythorne, Alderley and Enoggera to Ferny Grove. Loses the suburb of Everton Park along with the remainder of the suburbs of Chermide West and McDowall that's south of Rode Road to Stafford. Gains all the tiny area west of Albany Creek from Aspley.

Gains all the City of Moreton Bay parts of the seat including the suburb of Ferny Hills and the remainder of the suburbs of Bunya and Arani Hills from Ferny Grove. Renamed Albany Creek after the Creek that makes up much of its border and divides it from the City of Brisbane. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 37,800 (-6.12%), Projected Electors 39,160 (-12.35%).

Pine Rivers – Current Electors 41,775 (+3.75%), Project Electors 45,767 (+2.43%). Remains Unchanged. Renamed Samsonvale after the Lake at its centre as the name Pine Rivers could be confused with the new seat of Pioneer River. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,775 (+3.75%), Project Electors 45,767 (+2.43%).

Redcliffe – Current Electors 42,657 (+5.94%), Project Electors 49,979 (+11.86%). Loses parts of the suburbs of Kippa-Ring, Clontarf and Newport west of Jabiru Canal down Boardman Drive west along Klinger Road down Anzac and Elizabeth Avenues and Snook Street down to the Houghton Highway to Murrumba. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 36,237 (-10.00%), Projected Electors 42,897 (-3.99%). I thought about removing Moreton Island as there are no longer any transport routes from Redcliffe. However, my current redistribution would push it over the threshold of -10% and this can probably be left for another day. It probably belongs in Clayfield or Llyton where the transport links are.

Murrumba – Current Electors 47,816 (+18.76%), Project Electors 56,568 (+26.61%). Loses the locality of Dakabin along with part of the suburb of Kallangur that's north of Anzac Avenue to Kurwongbah. Gains parts of the suburbs of Kippa-Ring, Clontarf and Newport west of Jabiru Canal down Boardman Drive west along Klinger Road down Anzac and Elizabeth Avenues and Snook Street down to the Houghton Highway from Redcliffe. Gains a small portion of the suburb of Rothwell north of Deception Bay Road from Bancroft. Renamed Hays after the Hays Inlet that lies within the seat. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,661 (-1.49%), Projected Electors 47,559 (+6.45%).

Bancroft – Current Electors 41,682 (+3.52%), Project Electors 46,872 (+4.91%). Loses a small portion of the suburb of Rothwell north of Deception Bay Road to Murrumba. Renamed Deception Bay after the Bay that's the seat encompasses. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,751 (+1.22%), Projected Electors 45,998 (+2.95%).

Kurwongbah – Current Electors 42,744 (+6.16%), Project Electors 50,227 (+12.42%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Burpengary along with part of the suburb of Narangba north of New Settlement Road and Oakey Flat Road to Morayfield. Gains the locality of Dakabin along with part of the suburb of Kallangur that's north of Anzac Avenue from Murrumba. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 44,003 (+9.29%), Projected Electors 51,372 (+14.98%).

Morayfield – Current Electors 43,643 (+8.39%), Project Electors 54,141 (+21.18%). Loses the suburb of Caboolture and the part of the locality of Bellmere that's north of the Caboolture River to the new seat of D'Aguilar. Gains the remainder of the suburb of Burpengary along with part of the suburb of Narangba that's north of New Settlement Road and Oakey Flat Road from Kurwongbah. Given SA1s 31302136902 and 31302136906 are in both Glass House and Morayfield I've provided and estimated

range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 42,429 (+5.38%)-43,117 (+7.09%), Projected Electors 49,665 (+11.16%)-53,849 (+20.52%).

Pumicestone – Current Electors 43,422 (+7.84%), Project Electors 47,855 (+7.18%). Loses the remainder of the locality of Moodlu and the part of the suburb of Caboolture that's west of Beerburum Road to the new seat of D'Aguilar. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,738 (+1.18%), Projected Electors 44,206 (-1.06%).

D'Aguilar – CREATED – Current Electors 0,000 (-100.00%), Project Electors 0,000 (-100.00%). Gains all the Somerset Region from Nanango. Gains all the City of Moreton Bay from Glass House. Gains the parts of the localities of Caboolture and part of the locality of Bellmere that's north of the Caboolture River from Morayfield. Gains the remainder of the locality of Moodlu and the part of the suburb of Caboolture that's west of Beerburum Road from Pumicestone. Named D'Aguilar after the D'Aguilar Range at the centre of the seat. Given SA1s 31302136902 and 31302136906 are in both Glass House and Morayfield and SA1 31302136702 is in both Glass House and Pumicestone I've provided and estimated range. After redistribution enrolment is estimated as, Current Electors 42,823 (+6.36%)-43,819 (+8.83%), Projected Electors 55,306 (+23.79%)-59,792 (+33.83%). I thought about naming the seat Caboolture after the Caboolture River but that only lies in the eastern Moreton Bay parts of the seat and went with something that would be inclusive of the Somerset Region parts of the seat and the D'Aguilar mountain range sits in the centre. An alternative name would be Somerset after the Lake at the centre of the seat.

SOUTH BRISBANE

Llyton – Current Electors 40,204 (-0.15%), Project Electors 42,102 (-5.77%). Gains most of the suburb of Murarrie except a small portion west of Creek Road and south of Road from Bulimba. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,313 (+5.09%), Projected Electors 44,230 (-1.00%).

Chatsworth – Current Electors 37,203 (-7.60%), Project Electors 37,468 (-16.14%). Loses part of the suburb of Carindale that's between Pine Mountain Road and Scrub Road to Mansfield. Gains part of the suburbs of Cannon Hill and Carina east of Creek Road from Bulimba. Gains part of the suburb of Camp Hill that's east of Creek Road from Greenslopes. Renamed Tingalpa after the Tingalpa Creek that borders it and separates the City of Brisbane from Redlands City. Also, the seats namesakes Chatsworth Road no longer inside the district and hasn't been for some time although these new boundaries push it back up to the very edge of it. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 39,111 (-2.86%), Projected Electors 42,582 (-4.69%).

Bulimba – Current Electors 42,348 (+5.17%), Project Electors 43,846 (-1.86%). Loses most of the suburb of Murarrie except a small portion west of Creek Road and south of Road to Llyton. Loses part of the suburbs of Cannon Hill and Carina east of Creek Road to Chatsworth. Gains part of the suburb of Camp Hill that's west Bennetts Road along with the remainder of the suburb of Norman Park and part of the suburbs of Stones Corner and Coorparoo that's north of Old Cleveland Road from Greenslopes. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 41,711 (+3.59%), Projected Electors 43,471 (-2.70%).

Greenslopes – Current Electors 39,023 (-3.08%), Project Electors 42,830 (-4.14%). Loses part of the locality of Camp Hill that's east of Creek to Chatsworth. Loses part of the locality of Camp Hill that's west Bennetts Road along with the remainder of the locality of Norman Park and part of the

localities of Stones Corner and Coorparoo that's north of Old Cleveland Road to Bulimba. Gains part of the locality of Mount Gravatt East that's north of Creek Road from Mansfield. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,552 (-4.25%), Projected Electors 42,236 (-5.47%).

Mansfield – Current Electors 36,881 (-8.40%), Project Electors 41,558 (-6.92%). Loses part of the suburb of Mount Gravatt East that's north of Creek Road to Greenslopes. Gains part of the suburb of Carindale that's between Pine Mountain Road and Scrub Road from Chatsworth. Gains part of the suburb of Eight Mile Plains that's north of Padstow Road, almost the entire suburb of Macgregor except the tiny bits west of Mains Road, a very small part of the suburb of Upper Mount Gravatt that's east of Mains Road and a small part of the suburb of Sunnybank that's east of Mains Road from the abolished seat of Toohey. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 37,646 (-6.50%), Projected Electors 41,977 (-6.05%).

South Brisbane – Current Electors 42,034 (+4.40%), Project Electors 52,792 (+18.16%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Annerley along with part of the suburbs of Dutton Park and Woolloongabba that's south of the Beenleigh/Cleveland Rail Line and the very small parts of the suburb of Greenslopes west of the Junction Street to Miller. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 38,668 (-3.96%), Projected Electors 48,961 (+9.58%).

Miller – Current Electors 36,894 (-8.37%), Project Electors 38,592 (-13.62%). Loses everything west of Oxley Creek including the suburbs of Chelmer and Gracewood along with the remaining parts of the suburbs of Sherwood and Corinda to Mount Ommaney. Gains the remainder of the suburb of Annerley along with part of the suburbs of Dutton Park and Woolloongabba that's south of the Beenleigh/Cleveland Rail Line and the very small parts of the locality of Greenslopes west of Junction Street from South Brisbane. Gains the suburb of Nathan, the remainder of the suburbs of Rocklea and Moorooka along with most of suburb of Salisbury that's north of Kessels Road and Riawena Road and the small parts of Mount Gravatt and Upper Mount Gravatt west of the Pacific Motorway from the abolished seat of Toohey. Now contains the namesake of Toohey. Renamed Tarragindi due to significant changes. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,956 (+6.69%), Projected Electors 45,460 (+1.75%).

Mount Ommaney – Current Electors 37,187 (-7.64%), Project Electors 37,653 (-15.73%). Loses the remainder of the suburb of Wacol along with parts of the suburbs of Oxley and Darra south of the Main Rail Line, Englefield Road, Oxley Road and Logan Avenue to Inala. Gains everything west of Oxley Creek including the suburbs of Chelmer and Gracewood along with the remaining parts of the suburbs of Sherwood and Corindal from Miller. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,759 (+6.20%), Projected Electors 43,249 (-3.20%).

Inala – Current Electors 39,709 (-1.38%), Project Electors 41,266 (-7.64%). Gains part of the City of Brisbane namely the remainder of the suburb of Forest Lake from Jordan. Gains the remainder of the suburb of Wacol along with parts of the suburbs of Oxley and Darra south of the Main Rail Line, Englefield Road, Oxley Road and Logan Avenue from Mount Ommaney. There are only a few Electors between the Logan Freeway and Jordan Road. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 43,705 (+8.55%), Projected Electors 45,600 (+2.06%). Southern Boundary shifted to the edge of the City of Brisbane namely Jordan Road and the locality of Forest Lake. Eastern Boundary shifts to be in line with localities inside Inala along Oxley/Blunder Creek.

Alger – Current Electors 41,078 (+2.02%), Project Electors 43,763 (-2.05%). Loses the part of the suburbs of Browns Plains and Regents Park to Logan. Loses the part of the suburbs of Forestdale and Hillcrest to the new seat of Flagstone. Gains the part of the City of Brisbane namely part of the suburb of Heathwood from Jordan. Gains the suburbs of Stretton, Drewvale and Karawatha along with the remainder of the suburb of Calamvale from Stretton. Renamed Calamvale after the most populous suburb in the seat after major territorial change. Now contains the namesake of Stretton.

After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 42,308 (+5.08%), Projected Electors 44,755 (+0.17%). Southern Boundary shifted to the edge of the City of Brisbane namely Jordan Road and the locality of Forestdale. Western Boundary shifts to be in line with suburbs inside Alger along Oxley/Blunder Creek.

Stretton – Current Electors 34,903 (-13.32%), Project Electors 35,774 (-19.93%). Loses the suburbs of Stretton, Drewvale and Karawatha along with the remainder of the suburb of Calamvale to Alger.

Loses the small part of the suburb of Browns Plains to Logan. Loses the tiny part of the suburb of Berrinba to Woodridge. Gains the suburbs of Coopers Plains and Robertson, the remaining part of the suburb of Runcorn and Acacia Ridge, the majority of the suburb of Sunnybank except for a small protrusion between McCullough Street and Mains Road that is now in Mansfield, a small part of the suburb of Macgregor that's west of Mains Road, part of the suburb of Eight Mile Plains south of Padstow Road and a small bit of the suburb of Salisbury south of Riawena Road from Toohey.

Renamed Sunnybank after the populous suburb in the seat due to significant changes and both districts' names being outside the seat. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 40,658 (+0.98%), Projected Electors 42,083 (-5.81%).

Both Toohey and Stretton provided nearly 50/50 of the seats Electors however both namesakes were no longer in the seat and therefore a new name was needed.

Toohey - ABOLISHED – Current Electors 34,942 (-13.22%), Project Electors 36,833 (-17.56%). Loses the suburbs of Coopers Plains and Robertson, the remaining part of the suburb of Runcorn and Acacia Ridge, the majority of the suburb of Sunnybank except for a small protrusion between Mains Road and Padstow Road that is now in Mansfield, a small part of the locality of Macgregor that's west of Mains Road, part of the suburb of Eight Mile Plains south of Padstow Road and a small bit of the suburb of Salisbury south of Riawena Road all the area north the Freeway to Stretton. Loses the suburb of Nathan, the remainder of the suburbs of Rocklea and Moorooka along with most of the suburb of Salisbury that's north of Riawena Road and the small parts of Mount Gravatt and Upper Mount Gravatt west of the Pacific Motorway to Miller. Loses part of the suburb of Eight Mile Plains that's north of Padstow Road, almost the entire suburb of Macgregor except the tiny bits west of Mains Road and a small part of the locality of Sunnybank that's east of Mains Road and north of Padstow Road to Mansfield. Seat ABOLISHED. Namesake is now in Miller. After redistribution enrolment is, Current Electors 0,000 (-100.00%), Projected Electors 0,000 (-100.00%).

Post Redistribution Analysis

NORTHERN QUEENSLAND

Looking at the initial numbers one thing was obvious a seat in Northern Queensland needed to be abolished to bring the deficits under control. For that the choice was obvious, the seat of Mirani. It begins in the outer areas of Mackay and ends in the outer areas of Rockhampton straddling the coast across 4 LGAs, Mackay, Isaac Region, Livingstone Shire and Rockhampton. The other only real

choice was Callide but Mirani was the bigger problem. i started at the tip in Cook initially drawing it further into the Shire of Mareeba from Barron River. and pushing Traegar into Hills Tablelands. I then drew Hill up to the Mulgrave River then split the Townsville parts of Burdekin to top up the Townsville based seats as there is currently quota for about 3.5 seats, so it made no sense to have it in 5. I initially drew Mundingburra to the edge of the City of Townsville in Burdekin and a bit into Thuringowa and Townsville into Mundingburra and then Thuringowa into Hinchinbrook. After working my way down to Gregory and finding excess numbers there I decided to change my approach in the North. Cook now takes in all Mareeba Shire from Hill instead. Cairns which currently makes up less than 3 quotas is drawn into 4 seats. So, I've drawn it out of Hill and back into Mulgrave. This allows it to help Cairns. Hill then takes in the rest of the Cassowary Coast. This effectively brings Hinchinbrook back to quota. This results in the loss of Hinchinbrooks namesake Hinchinbrook Island. I was suggested to name it Ingham but while considering that I realised the seat gets most of its electors from the City of Townsville and rather than pick a name that alienates either the regional/rural electors or the Townsville based city electors i went with something that included both. It's short on Current Electors but recovers on Projected Electors. Thuringowa then moves partially into Mundingburra and Townsville remains the same unchanged. Mundingburra then moves into Buderkin to the edge of Townsville as before. Burdekin loses the parts of Townsville to Mundingburra and Issac Region to Gregory then pairing with the Whitsunday Region to form a seat. Gregory then sheds the Shires of Winton, Boulia and Marrekat to Traegar. Mackay has 2 and a bit quota but is currently drawn over the main seat of Mackay and 2 partial seats of Whitsunday and Mirani. Mackay extends to the Ring Road that's south of Pioneer River. A second Mackay seat is formed that extends all the way to Alligator River. I've renamed a few seats, namely 6. Cook shares a name and namesake with a federal seat so I've renamed it York after the Cape it covers. Hill in line with naming provisions becomes Johnstone after the river that flows through the seat. Hinchinbrook loses its namesake and is replaced with Halifax after the Bay that straddles the seat from Ingham to Townsville. Burdekin now contains both namesakes, but I've left it as Burdekin given it contributed the most electors. However, ive left the naming open as Whitsunday Region provides more electors. In line with special naming provisions ive left Traegar and Gregory as is due to the vastness of the seat not centring anywhere really. However, Gregory has the potential to become more centralised due to changes but to preserve the name of a longstanding seat I've proposed transferring the name to Traegar along with the almost 200,000 sqkm. Gregory would be known as Thomson or Alice. Rivers that dump into Cooper Creek and feed Lake Eyre in South Australia. The new seat in Mackay would be known as Pioneer River.

BURNETT & WIDE BAY

Keppel drops all of Rockhampton and moves up to Alligator River. Rockhampton then takes in the rest of its City and Callide moves up to take in the excess. It drops Gladstone to Gladstone and Bundaberg to Burnett. Which in turn fixes up Bundaberg. Callide then drops the former Wambo Shire to Warrego to help fix it up. Although it helps it in the short term in 7 years it's back to needing repairs but that's a problem for then. Hervey Bay drops everything outside to to Maryborough and Kgori to Gympie which moves up the Eastern shore of the Mary River while dropping the western shore to Nanango. Nanango drops Toowoomba Regional to Condamine and Somerset to the new Moreton Bay seat. Several seats here change name. Keppel become Shoalwater after the Bay in Central Queensland. An alternative would be Broad Sound or Fitzroy after the River. Callide is still relevant so I've held off renaming that one. Though I'm hoping to free up Theodore so he can be honoured by use of the namesake town named after him and still meet naming provisions. Nanango

becomes Barambah after being centred on Barambah Lake. Gympie would become Sandy after the Strait or Tin Can Bay. The new seat in Moreton Bay is D'Aguilar but more on that later.

SOUTHERN QUEENSLAND

Southern Downs moves into rural localities of Toowoomba from Condamine and reunites a couple suburbs in Toowoomba South and that in turn reunites a Toowoomba North suburb. Lockyer remains unchanged. Given how many seats Toowoomba now encompasses and the fact they are in the centre I've renamed the two seats in the city along with Condamine as the namesake is at the very bottom of the seat and is partially in Southern Downs. Toowoomba North is simply Toowoomba, Toowoomba South is now Harristown after the populous suburb and Condamine is Oakey.

SUNSHINE COAST

Home of probably the most difficult seat to draw in Caloundra. Between Noosa and the Sunshine Coast there is about 8 quotas worth of a seat. Noosa moves into some of the localities north of the Highway. Nicklin and Ninderry are relatively unchanged but for some minor changes. Maroochydore and Kawana are unchanged. Buderim loses stuff south of the Creek while taking in more of its namesake. The real changes are in Glass House and Caloundra where all the surplus is. Glass House sheds its Moreton Bay territory and takes in a bit from Caloundra that Sa1 though is hard to break so I've drawn both seat under quota on Current numbers, but they make up for it over the Projected Enrolment. Caloundra will be hard to break down further until next redistribution but overall, they only need to meet the Current Enrolment quota. Nicklin changes to Nambour under naming provisions. Everything else is unchanged. Glass House despite big changes retains its namesake and many of the Current Electors so I kept that. Glass House does though provide most electors and territory to the new seat in Moreton Bay.

GOLD COAST

The Gold Coast currently has 11.06 quotas with a Projected forecast of 11.40 quotas by 2032. This means the current 11 seats can be maintained within its current 11 seats despite the excess in Coomera this can be shifted around the other seats within the Gold Coast and the Project excess .40 of a quota shared amongst them. I have gone for natural boundaries if the Current Enrolment is met and not too much excess on the Projected Enrolment.

REDLANDS CITY Redlands City currently has enough quota for 3 seats and does not need to cross the boundary in either direction. It currently crosses into the City of Logan in the district of Springwood. I have eliminated this crossing by drawing Redlands to the LGA boundary. Shifted populations within Oodergoo and Capabala. Oodgeroo reverts to its previous name of Cleveland. This is not a judgement on the name of Oodgeroo but merely in line with my naming guidelines. This also frees up the name for a future federal seat as the name was in the mix by the AEC.

BRISBANE - SOUTH OF THE RIVER

Currently has 12 seats but only enough quota for 11 even after you remove the parts of the City of Logan. For this reason, I have abolished one seat namely the seat of Toohey. Toohey and Stretton are both almost equally under quota so one of these had to go. I chose Toohey because I thought it would be easier given its in centre of 4 seat that are a part of the City of Brisbane. As opposed to

Stretton which shares a border with the City of Logan, but the result would be the same. Toohey is split between Miller (along with the namesake), Mansfield and the most going to Stretton. The other seats starting with Llyton fix up in a pattern. I tried to use major roads to form the boundaries, and I

have renamed 3 seats, Chatsworth, whose namesake is currently in Greenslopes is renamed to Tingalpa after the Tingalpa Creek that separates Brisbane and Redlands. Miller, whose namesake does not conform with my naming guidelines is renamed Tarragindi the populous centre of the seat.

It does contain Tooheys' namesake now, but this is a minority of its electors and wouldn't be justifiable. Finally, Stretton which loses its namesake to Algester and takes in close to a 50/50 split of

Stretton and Toohey. However, both namesakes are not in the current seat, so I've named it Sunnybank after the populous locality that's in the centre. Algester sheds all the parts of the City of Logan to Logan and the new seat of Flagstone. Along with taking in the parts of the City of Brisbane from Jordan. Inala does the same and Stretton loses its parts to Logan. X Road which is the boundary for the City of Brisbane and Logan is now the boundary for Algester and Inala.

LOGAN CITY & SCENIC RIM

The City of Logan currently has seats that overlap with neighbouring LGAs in all directions. Name the City of Brisbane in the seat of Algester, Redlands City in the seat of Springwood, Ipswich City the seat of Jordan and Scenic Rim Region in the seat of Scenic Rim. I have managed to eliminate all but the crossing with Scenic Rim. Logan currently has is spread across 8 seats but only has enough quota for 6 and a bit. Therefore, I have drawn it out of Brisbane, Redlands and Ipswich but left the crossing in Scenic Rim to top it up and have that for the excess to go in this time around. While Woodridge and Waterford are not deviating much, Springwood is under quota and once you remove Redlands City even more so and outside the deviation. Macalister is over quota and needs to shed voters but not

by enough to push it over the deviation. Logan is way outside quota and Jordan is also meaning there is an argument for a new seat in this area, but that seat is mostly based around Springfield in Ipswich City. Once you include the parts of Logan in Algester and less so in Stretton and Inala you can find enough quota for 6 seats within the required deviation and less of a surplus on the Projected Enrolment. For this reason, I have effectively shaken up all the Logan based seats and renamed all but one, the seat of Logan. By pairing some of the high growth areas with low electors with some of the higher electors and lower growth and some that are stable hence the balance in Waterford and Woodridge I was able to make 6 seats without too much surplus on future enrolment. Jordan has shed all its parts of the City of Logan and become the 4th full Ipswich seat named Springfield. This

allows for the creation of an additional full Logan seat that I've named Flagstone. It Electors co e mainly from Jordan and Logan with Algester making up the rest. This seat is created at the expense of the abolition of a seat in Brisbane south of the river which I detailed earlier. Initially I called it Greenbank, but I think the numbers in Flagstone will solidify faster and the new seat form around this area. The seat of Logan remains the same because it carries most of the electors from that seat and is still loosely based around the Logan River. Woodridge is renamed Marsden due to the loss of the locality of Woodridge to the seat of Slacks Creek formerly Springwood. Springwood is renamed due to despite carrying most of the electors to the new seat because of the new seat of Springfield possibly creating some confusion. Macallister is renamed due to the naming guidelines I set out at the start and Eagleby is the anchor locality. Waterford despite retains its namesake and gaining the remainder of it from Macalister has undergone major changes and is only a fraction of its former elector base requiring a new name. For this I've chose Albert after the Albert River which it straddles. The rest of the Electors of the City of Logan remain in Scenic Rim. Scenic Rim which previously contained parts of rural Ipswich sheds these to Ipswich West.

IPSWICH CITY

The City of Ipswich currently has enough electors for 4 seats with Projected Enrolment for 4.60 seats by 2032. I have been able to draw them into 4 seats by spreading that Projected Enrolment across the 4 Ipswich seats and into the City of Brisbane north of the river through the seat of Moggill. I will explore the reasons for that later. I imagine that come 2032 a 5th Ipswich seat will be justifiable probably at the expense of a Brisbane seat north of the river. I believe this seat will form around the parts of Ripley once they become populated. I'm predicting the Bremer River may be a good boundary choice. I have also been able to remove the parts of Ipswich currently in Scenic Rim and along with parts from the seat of Ipswich and place them into Ipswich West. That then sheds some electors to the City of Brisbane north of the river through the seat of Moggill. Jordan loses its parts of the City of Logan and becomes solely based around Ipswich, specifically the City of Greater Springfield. Although the electors here are currently not enough to form their own seat so takes in the surplus from the seat of Bundamba. The seat is then renamed Springfield due to major territory loss but maintains an overwhelming majority of the Current Electors. This in turn triggers the renaming of Springwood in Brisbane to avoid any confusion.

BRISBANE - NORTH OF THE RIVER

Once you separate the City of Brisbane from the City of Moreton Bay in Everton you wind up with about 10 seats worth of quota but slightly less on Projected Enrolment of about 9.75 quotas. For this reason, I chose to do a crossing with the over quota Ipswich seats and the under-quota Brisbane seats north of the river. Overall, I was able to establish solid boundaries and set up the seats for the next 7 years. I believe the next redistribution will see a Brisbane seat north of the river abolished in favour of a new seat created in Ipswich City. That is where the crossing comes in, this allows for a smooth flow of electors without the need to abolish a seat. As it will probably be a 60/40 seat on the Ipswich side if a crossing is required without an abolition. Although an abolition may take place. Starting in Nudgee I moved anti clockwise to fix up the seats and removing the Brisbane/Moreton Bay crossing. Everton is now a Moreton Bay seat that removed all the parts of Moreton Bay from the seat of Ferny Grove and shed its Brisbane voters to Ferny Grove and Stafford. This required Everton to be renamed after losing its namesake Everton Park. More on that later. I renamed 4 seats, Cooper to Paddington after the populous locality due to naming guidelines, I did consider Enoggera after the Enoggera Creek but placing the localities of Enoggera Reservoir and Enoggera in Ferny Grove I thought this might create some sort of confusion so I renamed Ferny Grove due to the changes I made to Enoggera instead as it also borders the Creek. McConnell to Brisbane after the CBD in line with other state capitols and due to my naming guidelines. Finally, Maiwar which I initially kept the same, but someone pointed out to me it occupies an insignificant portion of the river, and I decided Mount Coot-Tha should be brought back as it is the dominating feature of that seat.

MORETON BAY

Currently probably just under enough quota for 9 seats. Is currently spread across 10 seats but has three crossings. Two in Brisbane in the seats of Everton and Ferny Grove and one on the Sunshine Coast in Glass House. The Sunshine Coast has highly expected growth along with Moreton Bay so I figured it would be possible to create a seat solely based in each by splitting Glass House. Everton/Ferny Grove can be fixed by swapping their Electors on either side of Albany Creek which is the border of Brisbane and Moreton Bay. By splitting Glass House and shifting the surplus in Moreton Bay northwards, a new Moreton Bay seat can be created. It was entirely possible to make 9

seats in Moreton Bay but the parts of Somerset that came out of Nanango needed somewhere to go. So, by combining Somerset from Nanango, Moreton Bay from Glass House and the excess quota in the other Moreton Bay seats I was able to form a new seat. This comes at the expense of a seat in regional Queensland which is under quota namely Mirani being abolished as previously discussed. Redcliffe also has an issue that will need to be sorted eventually. It contains Moreton Island despite no longer having any transport routes which were shut down in the early 2000s and don't look like they will return. Due the Projected Enrolment I have however drawn Redcliffe at the lower end on Current Enrolment and removing it would tip it over. Its transport link lies in both Llyton and Clayfield. I would say Clayfield would be the better choice as it has more frequent services to Moreton Island. I have renamed 4 seats in the Moreton Bay area. Everton loses its namesake to Stafford, so a new name is needed. I initially went with Bunyavilla after the National Park at the centre but settled on Albany Creek after the Creek that encircles the seat and separates the City of Moreton Bay from the City of Brisbane. Bancroft is renamed to Deception Bay after the Bay it straddles despite minimal changes due to naming provisions set out. Murrumba is renamed to Hays after the Inlet it centres around. The new seat is named D'Aguilar after the Ranges that encompasses the seat. I initially thought to name it Caboolture after the Caboolture River but given that only centres around the Moreton Bay parts I went with something that would inclusive of the Somerset Region. The seat gets most electors and territory from Glass House followed by Somerset with the rest of Moreton Bay (Pumicestone & Morayfield) making up the difference but given that namesake is still in the retained seat of Glass House a new name was needed.
