Dear Secretary,

I hereby make the following 'Comments' on 'Suggestions' submitted for the current redistribution of Queensland State electoral boundaries.

General Comments:-

In the Commissions 'Overview of Suggestions about the Redistribution-Whole of State Submissions' the Commission states:- 'The Commission notes the variety of solutions and reasoning these submissions have applied to the same problems'.

The reason I did not give reasons in my submission was the lack of time to make the submission.

I believe the last redistribution in 2016/17 gave 2 months for the original 'Suggestions'.

I accept that the Electoral Act states 30 days must be given for 'Suggestions'.



I also accept that the Federal Redistributions only give 30 days for 'Suggestions', however Federal redistributions display the SA1's for each individual electorate as well as in numeral order.

This makes it much easier to ascertain which SA1's in each electorate.

When I rang the Electoral Commission, Queensland (ECQ) and spoke to a staff member in the redistribution section if a breakdown of SA1's was available I was told 'no'.

It meant I had to download 237 pages of numbers and then workout with the help of maps which SA1's fitted into each electorate.

This took a considerable time which would not be necessary if they had been provided by the Commission.

All the 'coloured heat maps in the world' are are not going to make a person's 'Suggestion' any easier if you don't have the essential tools to make a submission based on actual and projected enrolment figures in a 'user friendly' manner, i.e. SA1's with the current, projected and area dissected for each electorate.

That afternoon, Thursday, 10th July, 2025, I asked if the enrolment figures on SA1's that were split into a number of electorates were available.

I was told by the staff member he should be able to obtain them for me.

I gave him my email address and told him I would get back next week if they had not arrived.

As 'the splits' had not arrived by Monday, 14th July, 2025, I rang the staff member back and was told his superior said they would not to be made available.

On Friday, 18th July, 2025, I received an email which stated:-

'Thank you for your telephone conservation on Monday, 14th July regarding obtaining a list of split SA1's.

I've had further conversations with my superiors and our mapping specialists to determine whether we will be able to provide you with this data.

I can provide you with an update on this as soon as possible'.

I received this information on Tuesday, 22nd July, 2025, for which I thank the Commission.

By the time this information had arrived the 30 day 'Suggestion' period was 15 days old and I had already progressed some of my submission based on what information was available.

I had to check all the work I had already done, and redo some taking into account this additional information.

From what 'Suggestions' I have read very few have supported their submission with actual and projected enrolments, probably because it was too difficult and time consuming to go through 237 pages to find which SA1 fitted into which electorate.

Wayne Window (S95) did, but like me did not submit reasons for 'suggested electorates'.

I have been contributing to the redistributing process since the 1984 Federal Redistribution and I believe the first 'job' is to 'get the arithmetic right', and 'the rest will fall into place' i.e. reasons, maps etc.

When I called on Thursday, 10th July, 2025, I asked if there was a designated phone number for the Redistribution Secretariat,

I was told 'no'. You have yo go through the ECQ switch board.

On one occasion when I called I was given 'the run around' by the switch board operator.

When I asked for the person, in the redistribution section, whom I had been having contact with, I was asked what I wanted that person for.

Eventually the operator put me through and I had my query answered, however a direct line would saved a lot of hassle.

The Redistribution Commission has a separate web site to the ECQ by not a separate phone connection. Why?

Persons, like myself who do not use email are also at a disadvantage in submitting their contribution to the redistribution process.

I received emails, however any time I try and send them they don't want to 'go through'.

I have to reply on 'express mail' by Australia Post, which at times can be very unreliable.

Even if it the submission get there in the timeline Australia Post says it should I still loose at least a day from those who use emails.

I acknowledge and appreciate the assistance given by the Commission in this regard.

With these 'Comments' closing on a Monday I will have to post my submission on the Friday before, for it to arrive by the Monday, loosing 4 days on those sending by email.

Having explained the time restraints which impacted on my ability to include reasons with my 'Suggestions' I will do so now in conjunction with my 'Comments' on other submissions.

Maps:-

I have not included any maps,

I used the ABS maps, which I am used to.

I believe I have included enough information in my submission to be able to follow my intended boundaries by going to ABS, hence Statistical, hence Geography, hence boundaries.

I note that in the last round of Federal Redistributions the AEC did not provide separate maps.

They had a link to the ABS maps.

I note that the maps attached to the LNP submission had the name of the suggested electorate, lines on a page I take representing the boundary with no indication where those boundaries were.

I make my 'Comments' on their submission from the written information provided.

Names of Electorates

The names of electorates became a 'hot topic' during the 2016/17 redistribution process when the Redistribution Committee recommended a number of electorates names be changed from places, regions, or geographic features to names of people.

For State electorates (93 of them) I prefer names of places, regions, or geographic features to names of people, bearing in mind that a lot of those places, regions, or geographic features were originally named after people, e.g. Brisbane, Townsville, and Mount Isa.

I am reluctant to suggest wholesale name changes at this redistribution, solely on the basis of reverting back to the previous practice of naming electorates after places, regions, or geographic features as the LNP has suggested.

I believe that if a State electorate is named after a person that person should have relevance in that area.

I am comfortable with an electorate in the Sunshine Coast being named Nicklin, after former Premier, Frank Nicklin, who represented the neighbouring electorate of Landsborough.

I note the LNP in their submission suggested retaining the name 'Nicklin' and abolishing the rest.

I believe if the name 'Nicklin' is retained for a Sunshine Coast seat, the name 'Jordan' should be retained for an Ipswich based seat.

The name 'Jordan', after former Member, Vi Jordan, is linked to the Ipswich area just as Nicklin is to the Sunshine Coast. I cannot see the relevance of a Gold Coast electorate being named after Ted Theodore, other that he was a former Premier, however if the name 'Theodore' had been used for the electorate the 2016/17 Redistribution commissioned named 'Hill' I could see the relevance, as Mr Theodore represented the electorates Woothakata and Chillagoe, based on the Atherton Tableland.

I do not have a concern about some electorates having the same name as the relevant Local Authority as some of the contributors do.

This mainly occurs in regional cities, such as Cairns, Townsville, Mackay, etc.

Electors seem to know the difference.

A number of redistributions ago, I think 1998/99, the Redistribution Commission suggested added the word 'Central' to the electorate name, e.g. Cairns Central.

This was discontinued after a number of 'objections'.

In Cairns there is a shopping centre name 'Cairns Central' and the then local member 'objected' on the basis that she did not her electorate named 'after a shopping centre'.

I do not agree with the 'suggestion' by Mark Yorke (S117) that there be 'wholesale' changes to well established names of State electorates, such as Mulgrave to Edmonton, on the basis he selected the suburb/locality in the centre of his 'suggested electorate'.

Large District Allowance

There were varying opinions on the Large District Allowance and how it is implemented.

Mr Cameron Parker (S105) of Katters Australia Party, wants the allowance increased to 4% to 'better reflect the challenges of vast electorates'.

As a political party spokesman he knows, or should know, that this matter is outside the jurisdiction of the Queensland Redistribution Commission.

It is a matter for the Queensland Parliament to change the legislation if it so desires.

The same applies to his suggestion for 'Weighted Enrolment for Indigenous Council Areas'.

Katters Australia Party has 3 representatives in the current Queensland Parliament.

It is up to those representatives to take those matters forward in the correct sphere, the Queensland Legislative Assembly.

Christopher Wolfs (S61) wants to reduce the electorates that the Large District Allowance applies.

Wayne Window (S95) wants to create an electorate of 760,752sqkm, called Great Artesia, with 15,215 'notional electors'.

This 'suggested electorate' has only 25,375 current, and 25,587 projected electors.

From the map the only centre that could be described as having significant population is Mount Isa and it has a 'cloud over its head' with the foreign mining giant ceasing copper mining in the city and the future of the copper smelter being 'in the balance'.

In his summary of suggested electorates he has an electorate named 'Warrego', 461,418sqkm with a current enrolment of 52,043, and a projected enrolment 52,897.

His 'suggested electorate' has current enrolment is in excess of the allowable variation, on on projected enrolment, above the 10% variance.

He has supplied no map for his 'suggested Warrego' so I cannot tell where this 'suggested electorate' fits into the overall State map.

His submission has the 'suggested electorate' of Cook at 133,250sqkm.

He appears to have reduced the number of electorates eligible for the Large District Allowance from four to three.

I am **totally opposed** to an electorate such as Great Artesia when there are alternatives such as the one I have suggested, i.e. attaching larger population centres to these sparsely populated areas.

Most, if not all, of these sparsely populated centres have 'a line of travel' to a larger centre for medical, business, etc.

Cape York Peninsula to Cairns, mainly by air.

Gulf Country, to Atherton Tableland, then Cairns.

Towns along the Great Northern Railway, to Charters Towers then Townsville.

Bowen Basin, to Mackay.

Central Queensland, to Emerald and then Rockhampton.

South Western Queensland, to Toowoomba and possibly Brisbane.

I do not see the purpose of fitting all these sparsely populated areas in one electorate when it 'cuts across there line of travel' to a larger centre.

My Suggestion is to increase the number of electorate back to 5.

As can be seen in summary of Country Electorates (attached) my proposal only increases the total Notional Enrolment by 211.

Cook decreases by 1,328, Treager (suggested it be Dalrymple) decreases by 2,880, a total reduction of 4,208 and my suggested electorate of Tablelands has 3,686 notional electors.

The real increase in 'Notional Electors' is in my 'suggested electorate' of Gregory from 9,194 to 9,921.

I can not see any way around this.

Gregory has to obtain an increased to its enrolment.

No matter what areas are added to Gregory it will result in a large increase in the area of the electorate, thus an increase in the Large District Allowance.

In Warrego, I believe the Large District Allowance has disadvantaged residents living north and west of Dalby.

The parts Western Downs Regional Council, that are in the existing electorate of Callide, could be accommodated in the existing electorate of Warrego without the necessity to add in approximately 4000 'Notional Electors'.

I have suggested that Chinchilla be included in Warrego and the other areas be included in my suggested electorate of Condamine.

The LNP in their submission states:-

'Warrego:- Projected to fall outside quota in the medium term. Expending to include Jandowae and Bell which form a key community of interest with Dalby which is already situated within the electorate, stabilising enrolment through the projection horizon'.

Their submission makes no mention of Chinchilla, Miles, etc in Warrego, or their suggested electorates of Callide and Condamine.

What happens to those electors?

Do they just evaporate into space?

While I know it is outside the Redistribution Commissions jurisdiction, I believe there should be a conversation as to whether the arbitrary 2% over 100,000sqkm is the best way to compensate those residents living in the 'far flung' areas of the State.

As a starting point, I would suggest increasing the quota variance, instead of the 2% over 100,000swqkm, for those large electorates, to give the Redistribution Commission greater flexibility in determining the boundaries in those areas.

Over the years I have advocated for Standing Parliamentary Committee on electoral matters to be formed similar to the one that operates Federally. I believe the type of suggestion I have made above could be examined by such a Committee, having hearings in rural and remote areas.

At the present time the Redistribution Commission, every 7 years, is the only avenue for the public to discuss electoral matters.

That is probably why a number of the submissions discuss matters which are outside the Redistribution Commissions jurisdiction, such a one submission wanting to get rid of preferential voting.

I do not subscribe to Mr. Wolf submission that only 'remote areas' should be included in these 4 large electorates.

By bringing these electorates into the more populated areas reduces the size of the electorate, while still maintaining the extra allowances for those Members, such as increase electoral allowance, charter rights, and an extra office.

This I believe this reduces the number of remote communities to be serviced by the Member, and thus increases the quality of their representation.

My submission follows this belief by bringing Cook down into the northern suburbs of Cairns, Dalrymple (Traeger) in the coastal areas south of Townsville.

Past redistributions have brought Gregory into Emerald, and Warrego into Roma and Dalby which I agree with.

Zoning the State

Mr, Bill Bates, President of Rexit Australia Inc (Regional Exit Australia) in his submission of 3rd August, 2025, tilted REXIT Submission No. 4 for QRC 2025 Electoral Boundary Review-

Electoral Areas and Quotas discusses ECQ Electoral Area designations and calls for the state to be divided into 3 designated Zones with a their own quota and *not create any electorates that cross Electoral Areas*.

I am totally opposed to this concept of having areas or zones within the State which dictate the boundaries of certain electorates.

This going back to the zonal system introduced by the Hanlon Government in 1949 and perfected by Jo Bjelke-Petersen in the 1970's in what Mr Bates refers to as a 'Bjeklemander'

I believe there should be only one restriction, in relation to geography, for the Redistribution Commissioners to dealt with i.e. the borders of the State.

It is my belief that the Redistribution Commission has grouped electorates together so that the general public has an idea whereabouts in the State each electorate is located, nothing more, nothing less.

This of upmost importance since the last redistribution moved away from naming electorates from places, regions or geographic features to names of people.

I believe these groupings have no bearing on where the boundaries are drawn, as they are not included as matters the Commissioners must consider, as well as keeping within the 10% variance, as set out in Section 46 of the Electoral Act.

Atherton Tableland

The LNP and its predecessors the Country Party and the National Party have treated the residents of the Atherton Tablelands with disdain ever since Eddie Wallis-Smith defeated Tom Gilmore (Snr) in 1963, in the electorate called 'Tablelands', and held onto it in 1966 and 1969.

Their attitude has been 'it should be our seat' and seeing isn't, 'lets abolish it'.

This occurred in the 1971 Redistribution, not by the Electoral Commissioners, but by the Bjelke Petersen Government's Electoral Act which split the then existing electorate in 3 different zones.

Kuranda went into the Cairns area of Provisional Cities Zone.

The Atherton and Herberton Shires went into the Country Zone.

Dimbulah (part of the Mareeba Shire) together with Etheridge, Croydon, Carpentaria and Cook Shires were placed in the Western and Northern Zone.

The indigenous communities of Kowyama and Pormpuraaw, which were in the then existing electorate of Tablelands, were included into the Northern and Western Zone.

This zonal breakup of the electorate resulted in:-

Atherton Shire going into Mulgrave.

Herberton Shire going into Mourilyan

Kuranda going into Barron River

Those communities placed in the Northern and Western Zone went into Cook.

In 1985 when Jo Bjelke-Petersen's National Party Government had only a one seat majority they increased the size of the Parliament to 89 members to try and sure up their majority at the 1986 election.

The electorate of Tablelands was recreated, taking in Mareeba and Kuranda from Barron River, and the Atherton Shire from Mulgrave.

Tom Gilmore (Jnr) won the electorate for the National Party and held it until the 'rise of One Nation' at the 1998 State Election.

Shaun Nelson won the electorate for the One Nation Party at that election.

During the term Mr. Nelson left the One Nation Party and contested the electorate at the 2001 elections as an Independent, which he lost to One Nations' Rosa Lee Long.

The next Redistribution after Ms Lee Long election, occurred in 2007, where the National Party convinced the Redistribution Commission to abolish the electorate of Tablelands and place Mareeba into Cook and the rest of the Tablelands, including Dimbulah, into a new electorate called Dalrymple with Charters Towers and the Central Queensland mining town of Moranbah.

The sitting LNP member for Charters Towers, Shane Knuth, won the new electorate from Ms Lee Long and the Atherton Tableland was 'back in the LNP's stable', but not for long.

In October, 2011, Mr Knuth resigned from the LNP and joined the KAP.

He held the electorate for the KAP at the 2015 election.

So now comes the 2017 redistribution.

The LNP suggest abolishing Mr Knuth's electorate and creating a new electorate called Palmerston, which included the Atherton Tableland and the coastal are area from Babinda to just south of Tully.

Remember Mr Knuth originally won the electorate of Charters Towers and probably lived in Charters Towers.

Charters Towers would be no longer be in the electorate if the the Redistribution Commission accepted their 'suggestion'.

The Redistribution Commission basically accepted the LNP 'suggestion' and called the electorate Hill.

Mr Knuth contested the electorate of Hill and won, holding it at the 2020 and 2024 elections.

Now comes this redistribution and the LNP, not being able to win the electorate containing the Atherton Tableland, have decided 'if you can win it abolish it'.

They have 'suggested' to you, further splitting the Atherton Tableland with Atherton, Tolga, Herberton and Ravenshoe be placed in the Mount Isa based electorate of Traeger and Malanda and Millaa Millaa in the coastal electorate of Hinchinbrook which currently extends from just south of Tully to the northern outskirts of Townsville.

The LNP's submission makes no mention of Dimbulah.

Where do the intend that town to go?

The LNP submission says Abolish Hill- The Atherton Tablelands communities are better represented when split along their natural economic gravity: the inland agricultural towns (Herberton, Ravenshoe, Atherton and Tolga) gravitate towards the south west, while the coastal rainforest towns (Malanda, Millaa Millaa) look east to Cairns.

What rot!

Atherton, Tolga, Herberton don't look towards Mount Isa 1,124 kms and 12hours 28minutes away (according to Google maps).

They are the same as the rest of the Tableland, look to Cairns 80km and 1hr 25m away (according to Google Maps) away on the coast is where they go to for goods and services not available on the Tableland.

Malanda and Millaa are not coastal towns.

They are a part of the Atherton Tableland, with Atherton being their first 'port of call' for goods and services, then Cairns.

Similar primary production is carried on whether it is in Malanda or Atherton or Tolga.

I know, I owned a business in the area some time back.

The LNP further in the submission states:- Abolishing Hill enables surrounding seats to regain quota without fragmenting these Tablelands linkages and avoids a cascade of disruptive adjustments throughout Northern Queensland.

The LNP is fragmenting the Tablelands by suggesting the furthering splitting of the area.

It is split three ways now, if you include Kuranda, which is in the Mareeba Shire, but has close connections to the northern suburbs of Cairns. Mareeba is in Cook, and the rest is in Hill.

Now they want to cast Atherton, Tolga, Herberton and Ravenshoe off to Moutn Isa and Malanda and Millaa Millaa off to Ingham.

The only winners out of the LNP 'suggestion' is the LNP.

By abolishing an electorate which they believe they should hold, but they can't, and at the same time protecting one of their seats further south which on the numbers should be abolished they are 'killing two birds with the one stone'.

While I has suggested changes to the six northern electorates (including Hinchinbrook) none should be abolished.

The total enrolment and projected enrolment of the six electorates north of Townsville is such that all six can be maintained.

The same cannot be said about the electorates south of Townsville.

The residents of the Atherton Tableland deserve better than what the LNP want 'to dish up to them'.

I invite the Commissioners to come to the Far North and have public hearings to listen to what the locals think of the LNP's proposal to 'abolish one of their seats'.

Six electorates north of Townsville:-

On the current enrolments and projected enrolments I believe all six can be maintained, however I do 'suggest' that there be changes to better comply with Section 46 of the Electoral Act.

Also by bringing Hinchinbrook north it allows Townville to maintain it three electorates as most on the new housing developments in the Townsville area has occurred outside those three electorates, either to the north (Bushland Beach) north west (Bohle Plains/AliceRiver) or the south (Stuart)

I suggest that the Redistribution Commission determine boundaries for the six Northern electorates similar to those the 1998/1999 Electoral Commission decided on, subject to changes necessary to meet the requirements of the Electoral Act with regard to the quota and the allowable variance.

Cook

I believe what the Redistribution Commission decides as to the composition of the electorate of Cook will have a 'flow on' effect right down to Townsville, and possibly further south and west to the Northern Territory border.

The existing electorate stretches from the Papua New Guinea border through the Torres Strait, down through Cape York Peninsula to the Douglas Shire.

It also includes the town of Mareeba which I suggest be transferred to my suggested electorate of Tablelands (replacing the existing electorate of Hill).

Why?

The principle means of travel for the residents of Torres Strait is by boat throughout the Islands, however when they have to travel outside the Islands it is by air.

Commercial air services from the Horn Island and the 'Cape' have Cairns Airport as their destination, **not Mareeba**.

There is limited public transport from Cairns to Mareeba, for those coming down from the Islands and the Cape to get to Mareeba to access the services provided by the Local Member's Office if it is located in that town.

Rail motor services from Cairns to Atherton Tableland was discontinued by the Bjelke Petersen Government in late 1980's.

Over the years, ever since there has been Member's Offices, the majority of the Members for Cook have had their Office in Cairns, as they consider it the most suitable location to service the whole of electorate including the Douglas Shire.

The residents of Mareeba believe, as it is the largest town in the electorate, the Office should be Mareeba.

This denies constituents, coming to Cairns by air, access to the local Members Office if they have to come to Cairns for Medical appointments, etc.

Medical Services are limited on the 'Islands' and in the 'Cape'.

The Cairns Hospital being the most northerly major hospital in the State, usually have of residents from the 'Islands' and the 'Cape' attending the hospital either as inpatients or as day patients, housed in the motels, etc. adjacent to the hospital.

Roads in Cape are improving, however not all are to the standard that they are accessible during the 'wet season', and there will never be a road to Saibai, Badu and Boigu Islands.

The current Member promised during the election campaign to have his Office in Mareeba, however the Queensland Parliament website list his offices, in Cairns and Thursday Island.

Being a large electorate the Member is entitled to two offices.

The second one, I understand usually has been in Thursday Island.

If the Member shifts the Cairns Office to Mareeba, it will cause difficulties for constituents flying into Cairns to access the local Member.

Should the Redistribution Commission support my suggestion, the Member could have his/her Electoral Office in the electorate at the Northern Beaches.

Constituents flying into Cairns could still access the Electoral Office as there is a suburban bus service which goes as far as Palm Cover at least hourly on working week days.

The LNP submission states:- *only minor changes are proposed*, however they did not explain what those changes are, and as I said earlier their maps are difficult to follow.

The ALP submission says:- As there is no case for material change, the ALP submits the five electorates in Far North Queensland do not need significant adjustment.

For the reasons I have outlined above I do believe there is a case for change to enhance Section 46 of the Electoral Act, especially ways of communications and travel within the proposed electoral district.

My submission suggests that the electorate, loose Mareeba and gain the Cairns Northern Beaches from Kewarra Beach north, and the town of Kuranda.

The 1998/99 redistribution brought the electorate of Cook down to *Deep Creek*, between Clifton and Kewarra Beaches.

I suggest Kewarra Beach also be included into Cook which then encompasses all of the SA2 *Clifton-Kewarra Beaches*.

From memory that Redistribution Commission justified their decision by pointing out the economic similarities (tourism) between those beaches, in particular Palm Cove/Ellis Beach and the Douglas Shire.

The same connection still remains, even though there is fierce competition between the two areas.

Kuranda:- I was reluctant to suggest relocating Kuranda from from the Barron River electorate, where it has been since the EARC redistribution in 1991, however Cook needed extra numbers to bring it closer to the quota for the current enrolment.

Kuranda, while in the Mareeba Shire, has a close affiliation with Smithfield, and the Northern Beaches which I suggest be included in the electorate of Cook.

Residents of Kuranda travelling to and from Cairns pass through Smithfield which has a large shopping centre at the foot of the Kuranda Range.

Many Kuranda residents work 'on the coast' and travel up and down the range daily.

Other than being a cooler residential suburb of Cairns, its local industry is based on tourist industry, Kuranda Scenic Rail, Skyrail, and a number craft shops, etc, which 'fits in' with the tourist industry of the Northern Beaches and the Douglas Shire.

Should the Redistribution Commission accept my suggested Cook, I also suggest the southern boundary of the Cook electorate follow the Federal Boundary along the McLeod, Mitchell and Nassau Rivers to the Gulf of Carpentaria.

This is a far more recognisable boundary that following the Cook/Mareeba Shire boundary.

Twice in recent times the Federal Redistribution Committee has suggested that Kuranda be taken out of Federal electorate of Leichhardt and put in Kennedy, where the rest of the Atherton Tableland is situated.

On both occasions the Augmented Committee has overturned the original proposal and left it in Leichhardt.

The last time was in 2007 when the Augmented Commission had a public hearing in Cairns and I appeared.

The Federal Redistribution Committee also proposed in 2007 to shift the Leichhardt/Kennedy boundary to the Mareeba/Cook Shire boundary and I was able to convince them to retain the Mitchell River as the boundary, on the grounds it is and more recognisable boundary and it is an 'existing boundary'.

Tablelands (replacing the existing of Hill)

I have earlier explained my opposition to the LNP suggestion to abolish the electorate of Hill.

I believe, subject to quota considerations, the coastal electorates should remain coastal, and the Atherton Tableland should have it own electorate, thus my suggested electorate of Tablelands.

As I said in my 'Comments on Suggestions' to the last Redistribution Commission, on 28th August, 2016, the electorate Hill is the old District of Mulgrave (1949 -1991) and the former District of Mourilyan (1971 – 1991) 'all over again'.

I live in Gordonvale and was involved in activities in the Mulgrave electorate during that time.

There is a large mountain range between the two areas of the electorate, coastal and the Atherton Tablelands, which divides the community of interest, and makes it difficult for the Member to work.

My suggested electorate of Tablelands is made up principally of the Atherton Tableland, topped up electors and notional electors from the 'Gulf' Shires of Etheridge, Croydon, and Carpentaria.

I accept there are 'community of interest' issues with this suggestion, such as Government services in the Carpentaria Shire being administrated from Mount Isa, also some of the residents of the Etheridge Shire use Charters Towers as their service centre instead of Atherton/Mareeba, because their children attend the education facilities in Charters Towers.

By the same token, the fishing industry and other private operators in Karumba use Cairns as their service centre.

To put the 'Gulf' into the proposed electorate of Tableland would take 3,352 current electors, 181,898sqkm, and 3,638 notional electors from the existing electorate of Traeger, which would make it much easier for the Member of Traeger to work.

From the other 'Suggestions' I have read, there is very little comment about the electorate of Hill except from the Babinda community wanting to return to the electorate of Mulgrave, which I will discuss in the electorate of Mulgrave.

Barron River

The LNP and the ALP want to leave the electorate of Barron River as it.

There has been very little discussion by the other contributors about the electorate of Barron River.

With my 'suggestion' the electorate of Barron River would transfer Kewarra Beach north, and Kuranda into my 'suggested electorate' of Cook.

To compensate these transfers, I suggest that the electorate of Barron River move back into familiar territory of Brimsmead, Edge Hill and Whitfield.

These suburbs have been in Barron River most of the time since its creation at the 1971 Redistribution, and fit comfortably in with the rest of the electorate.

Cairns

With 'my suggestion' moving Barron River into the suburbs of Brimsmead, Edge Hill and Whitfield, the electorate of Cairns moves south to the boundary which existed prior to the 2017 Redistribution i.e. Foster Road, Mount Sheridan.

The electorate of Cairns 'picks up' the suburbs of Woree, Bayview Heights and a part of Mount Sheridan (north of Foster Road) from the existing electorate of Mulgrave.

Neither the LNP or the ALP have suggested any changes to the existing electorate, while there have been some other submissions that Cairns move south.

Mulgrave

This is my home electorate, having lived in Gordonvale most my life, and having been involved with the electorate since 1969.

The 2017 redistribution was the first time since Mulgrave was formed in the 1949 redistribution that Babinda and Gordonvale have not been in the same electorate.

Further more, from what I can gather both towns were part of the Eacham electorate when was represented by former Premier William Gillies (1912-1925) and former Queensland Government Minister, Harry Bruce when the electorate was called The Tableland (1932-1950).

The Gillies Highway (Gordonvale to Atherton) is named after Mr Gillies.

The Bruce Highway (Brisbane to Cairns) is named after Mr. Bruce.

Gordonvale and Babinda are currently in same Division of the Cairns Regional Council, previously being Divisions 2 & 3 of the old Mulgrave Shire Council.

I totally support the suggestions from the Babinda residents calling for unification of the Babinda area (including Mirriwinni) into the Mulgrave electorate.

The LNP also supports the Babinda area being included in the electorate of Mulgrave.

The Mulgrave electorate up until the 2017 redistribution also has a component of the Johnstone Shire (now Cassowary Coast) in the electorate.

The one constant in Mulgrave from the Johnstone Shire was Flying Fish Point, up until the 2017 Redistribution.

In my submission I 'suggest' that all of the Babinda and Innisfail SA2's be included in the electorate of Mulgrave.

I believe this then allows the electorate of Hinchinbrook to move north, and the Townsville electorates to build their numbers up by taking some of the suburbs north of the Bohle River. I note that Wayne Window (S95) suggests that the electorate of Mulgrave extend onto the Atherton Tableland.

As stated previously I am totally opposed to any of the coastal electorates extending to the Atherton Tableland, except for Kuranda with has a close affinity to the northern suburbs of Cairns.

Hinchinbrook

I have already stated my opposition to the LNP's submission to transfer the Malanda, Millaa Millaa area into their suggested electorate of Hinchinbrook.

I am not sure what exactly the LNP intends to include their suggested electorate, all of the Malanda-Yungaburra SA2, or a just a part off it.

If all of the SA2 is included, plus Palm Island, I believe it takes the suggested electorate over 44,290 electors which is the maximum any electorate can have on current enrolments, that is assuming all of Bohle Plains SA2 is transferred to Thuringowa.

There submission only mentions Rangewood and Alice River.

I have enclosed a copy of my calculations.

I am opposed to transferring Palm Island into Hinchinbrook on the basis of reflecting the ferry service from Lucinda and longstanding cultural ties.

Be honest Mr. Riley, the reason you want Palm Island removed from the electorate of Townsville, where it has been at least since the EARC redistribution of 1991, is to help 'sure up' the electorate of Townsville for the LNP, when you only received 27.85% of the two party preferred vote at Palm Island in the 2024 election.

It has nothing to do with the matters detailed in Section 46 of the Electoral Act.

This issue was canvassed during the 'objection' phase of the 2017 Redistribution.

The Redistribution Commission in their final report states:-

The Commission had proposed that Palm Island be transferred to Hinchinbrook, as Palm Island Aboriginal Shire Council is surrounded by the Hinchinbrook Shire Council, and therefore they imagined this change would better unite local Councils in the area.

After reviewing public feedback, the Commission accepts that the major travel, communication and shared interests of Palm Island are with Townsville, and hence reversed this change, retaining Palm Island in Townsville.

I am unaware of anything has happened since the last redistribution that has changed the situation from where the major travel, communications and shared interests of Palm Island are with Townsville, to one where Ingham is the 'go to' town.

I therefore 'suggest' to the Redistribution Commission that they leave Palm Island in the electorate of Townsville.

My suggested Hinchinbrook looses that part of the Bohle Plains SA2 that is in the existing electorate, to the 'suggested' electorate of Thuringowa, and the suburbs of Mount Low, Beach Holm, and that part of Bushland Beach, south of the Mount Low Parkway, to the 'suggested' electorate of Townsville.

I believe my 'suggested electorate' of Hinchinbrook fulfils its purpose of being a coastal electorate from Innisfail to Townsville, and 'shrinks' enough at its southern end to allow the Redistribution Commission to retain the three Townsville electorates.

Katters AustralianParty (S105)says Management of Townsville under-quota Seats

The three Townsville-based electorates are all below quota, but the solution lies in minor adjustments within and between urban and peri-urban districts- not by shifting boundaries significantly of remote areas.

The KAP Member for Hinchinbrook, Nick Dametto, writes in his submission:- Should the Commission determine that changes must occur to meet enrolment targets, I strongly suggest that any boundary movement be made southward, toward the northern suburbs of Townsville. Expanding into areas such as Kalynda Chase would simply increase the electorate's footprint without fragmenting the core rural and suburban communities that define this seat.

Kalynda is a locality within the suburb of Bohle Plains.

From my calculations there are 3,192 current electors in this area and a projected 3,520.

I totally disagree with both submissions.

How could a responsible Member of Parliament and his political party advocate that the adjustment of the three electorates that all require additional electors be done within those electorates.

Your submissions just looses creditably.

Townsville Electorates

I do not subscribe to the 'suggestions' that Townsville loose one of it three electorates at this redistribution.

The issue with the three Townsville electorates is that they are all practically all 'fully developed'.

Other that 'in fill' and 'highrise' there is very little room for new residential developments.

Housing developments are occurring:-

• to the north, in the SA2's of Northern Beaches and Burdell-Mount Low which are in the existing electorate of Hinchinbrook.

SA1 31802158203 has a current enrolment of 0 and a projected enrolment or 2,860.

SA1 31802158213 has a current enrolment of 556 and a projected enrolment of 1,113.

- to the north west, the SA2 of Bohle Plains which is also in the existing electorate of Hinchinbrook.
- To the south in the SA2 of Townsville South which in the existing electorate of Burdekin.

SA1 31802148915 has a current enrolment of 747 and a projected enrolment of 2,177

The ALP says with regard to the Townsville electorates:- The ALP submits that the Townsville region, as the main urban centre of North Queensland, should retain its current representation of three provincial city electorates, with the boundaries rebalanced as necessary.

The LNP says:- Townsvill Metro rebalanced-

• Townsville gains Bushland Beach. Mount Low and Burdell (between Bohle and Black Rivers, north of the highway), cementing its northern growth corridor.

From my calculations placing all Burdell-Mount Low SA2 in the electorate of Townsville will bring the projected enrolment to 51,096, 4.36% above the 10% variance.

• Thuringowa gains Deeragun, Rangewood and Alice River, creating a coherent peri-urban arc south of the highway.

I believe all of the Bohle Plains SA2 would have to be included to capture Rangewood and Alice River, otherwise they would be 'islands'.

Assuming that is the case, I calculate the suggested electorate would have a current enrolment of 45,066 which is 111.03% of a quota, which does not comply with the legislative 10% variance.

• Mundingburra absorbs Heatley (from Thuringowa) and Rosslea, Hermit Park, Hyde Park, Mysterton and Currajong (from Townsville), restoring its suburban heart around Ross River. Together, these swaps keep each electorate recognisably 'Townsville' while re-setting voter parity.

While the LNP's Mundingburra is within the 10% variance for both the current enrolment and the projected enrolment, it is at 108.89% of a quota on current enrolments, and 103.46% on projected enrolments, they are a the upper end of the variance.

I have enclosed a copy of my calculations.

The LNP seems to have deliberately gone to the upper end of the 10% variance, and sometimes over, for their suggested electorates of Hinchinbrook, Townsville, Thuringowa, and Mundingburra.

There must have been a reason for this.

Was it to accommodate all the electors from Innisfail south, including Malanda and Millaa Millaa in four electorates, due their desire to abolish the KAP electorate of Hill?

These same four electorates under my suggestions are all within the 10% variances:-

Hinchinbrook:- Current 39,884 (99.06%) projected 45,739 (102.37%)

Townsville:- Current 41,773 (103.74%) projected 48,191 (107.86%)

Thuringowa:- Current 40,036 (100.43%) projected 40,977 (91.71%)

Mundingburra:- Current 38,820 (96.415) projected 41,252 (92.33%)

While the Townsville electorates are 'down on numbers' I believe by extending Townsville and Thuringowa northward, and adjusting Mundingburra accordingly, these electorates have a 'reasonable chance of staying within the 10% variance throughout the 7 years interval between redistributions, however this will depend on a number of issues which are now in discussion such as:-

• Increased Defence spending:- This will probably involve the Lavarack Army base in Townsville.

- Copperstring 2.0. Whether the State Government continues it from Hughenden to the North West Mineral Province.
- The future of the copper smelter in Mount Isa and the copper refinery in Townsville.
- The rail freight charges on the Great Northern Railway (Townsville to Mount Isa) with some phosphate mining companies 'floating' the idea of building a rail line to the Gulf of Carpentaria as they claim the freight rates charged by the privatised rail company is extreme.

Dalrymple (replacing the existing electorate of Traeger)

I have previously stated my opposition to including Atherton, Herberton and Ravenshoe in the Traeger electorate.

These towns have no economic, social, regional or other community of interest with the major population centre of Traeger, the city of Mount Isa, a mining town some 1100kms away.

The Atherton Tableland main economic activity is primary production.

I have 'done the numbers' on the LNP submission.

It is within the allowable variance, when including the Large District Allowance is included.

I enclose a copy.

These calculations do not include the part of the Tablelands SA2 that is in the existing electorate of Hill.

This area area includes the towns of Mutchilba, Dimbulah, Petford, Watsonville and Irevnebank, as well as the localities of Forty Mile and Springfield.

They have a current enrolment of 1,215, a projected enrolment of 1,139 and a total area of 49,851sqkm which equates to a notional enrolment of 997.

Including this area in the LNP 'suggested' electorate of Traeger would bring the current enrolment to 42,412, and a projected enrolment of 43,891 which is still within the 10% variance of the quota.

Should the Redistribution Commission accept the LNP 'suggestion', which I they do not, I would suggest that Mutchilba, Dimbulah and Petford be coupled with what ever electorate Mareeba ends up in as their lines of travel and communication are through Mareeba.

I believe the decision of the 2017 Redistribution commission to bring Trager eastwards into Charters Towers was the 'right one'.

During 2017 Redistribution during the 'Objection' phase the Charters Towers Regional Council expressed a desire to join the Burdekin electorate if their electorate of Dalrymple was to be abolished.

I note no such request was made in their submission to this Redistribution.

There only concern was:- On behalf of the Charters Towers Regional Council I am suggesting that there be no increase to the suze of the State electorate of Traeger as I am concerned that representation for local authorities and constituents in the State electorate of Traeger will decrease.

My 'suggested' electorate actually reduces in size substantially.

Lines of travel from Mount Isa, Cloncurry, Hughenden, etc are towards the coast and the City of Townsville.

Their produce is exported through the Port of Townsville.

As the existing electorate of Traeger needs additional voters, both current and projected I 'suggest' it move further east to take that part of the City of Towancille that is currently in the electorate of Burdekin.

When 'doing the numbers' I found that I had to take the 'suggested electorate' further south to the Burdekin River, excluding the town of Ayr.

Most of this area is in the Federal Division of Kennedy and I am unaware of any problems the local constituents have had with their representation.

During the 2007 Federal Redistribution, when this area was proposed to be transferred into the Division of Kennedy, I phoned the Federal Member for Kennedy office to gauge their opinion of the transfer.

The reply was 'Bob has to go through that area to get to Charters Towers when getting off the plane'.

I know the current Member of Traeger lives in Mount Isa, but that may not always be the case.

This coastal area gives the electorate some 'growth area' around Townsville with the enrolment of SA1 31802148915 in the Suburb of Stuart expected to increase from a current enrolment of 747 to a projected enrolment of 2,177 over the 7 year period.

To obtain an electorate within the allowable variance I have included that part of the Collinsville SA2 west of the Clarke Range in the 'suggested' electorate. .

The Clarke Range has been used as an electoral boundary on previous occasions, and currently used Federally for the boundary between Dawson and Capricornia.

By transferring the Croydon-Etheridge and Carpentaria SA2's from the suggested electorates reduces the size of the electorate by 181,898sqkm.

While 18,260sqkm is added in the Collinsville area the 'suggested electorate' is considerably smaller than the existing electorate and should result in an improved representation for those living in the electorate.

There have been a number of suggestions to increase the size of the existing electorate by adding some of the Far Western communities from the exiting electorate of Gregory, such at Boulia and Winton.

The objective is to put more 'notional votes' in to Traeger.

Winton is a part of the Central Queensland Community with the Longreach, Barcaldine and Blackall-Tambo Local Governments and I believe to put into Traeger disrupts their economic, social, regional community of interest factors.

Also there ways of communication, and travel the east is via Emerald to Rockhampton.

The Queensland Government allowed Queensland Rail to 'pull up' the railway connection from Winton to Hughenden many years ago, so there is nor even a rail connection to Northern Highlands any more.

The Boulia Shire Council requested the 2017 Redistribution Commission to transfer the Shire to Gregory at the "Objection' phase of that redistribution, which the Commission obliged.

The reason for the transfer was that the shire was in the *outback* tourism network, known as the Remote Area Planing and Development board or RAPAD Shires. These shires include Boulia, Diamantina, Barcoo, Winton, Longreach and Barcaldine.

However when the Federal Redistribution came around the LNP at the 'Objection' stage requested that the Boulia Shire be transferred to Maranoa from Kennedy.

The Boulia Shire did not make such an 'objection'.

This was noted by the Augmented Commission and the Boulia Shire was left in the Federal Electorate of Kennedy.

I wonder if their were other factors, outside the terms of reference, such as personalities, that made the Boulia Shire want to join with Winton and other Western Shires at one level of Government and not the other.

No matter what the reason I believe it makes sense that Boulia Shire remain with other Western Shires in the electorate of Gregory.

The name of the electorate.

This is one electorate that I suggest the name be changed from a person to a geographic name, even though there was a Mr Dalrymple, whose name was used for the Shire surrounding Charters Towers until the amalgamation prior to the 2009 Local Authority elections.

With my 'suggested' electorate moving eastwards I considered Dalrymple was more suitable for the electorate to be called than say Flinders, Mount Isa or Burke, all names given to electorates previously.

Interruption:-

As it is late on the night of Thursday 18th September, 2025, I have decided to interrupt my submission on 'Comments' so I can forward what have done so far by Australia Post express mail in hope that it arrives on Monday, 22nd September 2025.

I enclose a number of attachments which I have done in the intervening period from the close of 'Suggestion' to this date.

I will continue my 'Comments' over the weekend and trust that they will arrived in time for the Redistribution to consider them.
